## WSAA PRESIDENT: Linda Parker

At the Washington State Archery Association Convention, we awarded bids for the 2007 WSAA Championship Tournaments.

Our competitive season actually kicked off with the Multi-Color Mail-In which began on 1 December 2006 and concludes 31 January 2007. For the mail-in format, each archer shoots six rounds during the two-month period, usually at their local Club or Shop.

The Indoor Multi-Color Championship will be held in January 2007, at three sites: AS&J Archery in Yakima, Archery World in Vancouver, and Silver Arrow Bowmen at Mount Vernon. See the ad in this issue and please pre-register.

The Indoor Blueface Mail-In begins 1 February and runs through 31 March. Again, each participant is required to shoot six rounds during these months. The registration form and rules for this event are also in this edition of The Quiver.

Coming in March, There will be two hosts for the Indoor Blueface Championship: Evergreen Archers (at Kodiak Archery in Spokane) and Wilderness Archery in Bow. While we are still shooting indoors, the Northwest Indoor Sectional will be at KBH Archers range in Belfair. And some of us will wrap up the month of March with a trip to Louisville KY for the NFAA Indoor Nationals.

The Target Championship in April is an American 900 Round. This event and the WSAA Safari Championship in May will both be at Skookum Archers' range in Puyallup. The WSAA 3-D and Bowhunter Banquet will be at Cedar River Bowmen in June.

Darrington will host the WSAA Field Championship scheduled for 14-15 July, making a good practice opportunity for those planning to shoot the NFAA Outdoor National 23-27 July. Some of the details are developing quickly – see the Club News section for some of the lodging, dining, and entertainment information.

Concluding the season, East County Archers will again host the WSAA FITA at their range in McCleary, in August. And as a change this year, the Washington Senior Games will be changing locations, to use East County Archers' field.

Washington is also looking forward to hosting our second NASP State Championship tournament. The event will be on 28 April 2007, at Davis High School in Yakima. This program continues to grow and has participating schools in all parts of the state.

Including NAA and IBO events, plus shoots hosted by our state Clubs and Shops, there are a lot of tournament challenges to choose from all year long in Washington!

The weather during the 2006 hunting seasons was quite strange. First, extremely dry, followed by enough rain in November to bring the totals up to a normal year, and topped off by hurricane force winds which brought snow and falling trees. Despite all this, some of our members tallied successful hunts – congrats to Crystal Parker and Larry Ramsey, and thanks for the photos and stories. For all those who got big game in 2006, remember that 31 March is the deadline to apply for the WSAA Big Game Award or for the Big Buck and Big Bull awards. Forms are on the WSAA Web Site – [www.crispie.com/wsaa](http://www.crispie.com/wsaa) – in the hunting section.

The elections kept most of the same people in office. We welcome some new faces on the WSAA Board for 2007, including District Trustees Mike Bosisto, Jeff Coté, and Kent White. There is still a vacant position for the District 6 Trustee – this is the South East and South Central parts of the state. Clubs and Shops in this district are: AS&J Archery, Blue Mountain Archers, Colyak Bowhunters, Kamiakin Roving Archers, Mount Clemans Archery, and Wa-Ku-Wa Archers. I hope someone will volunteer.

### Attention Washington NAA Members

All NAA members who live in Washington will receive this January and the July issue of The Quiver. Washington State Archery Association is the NAA-recognized state level organization for Washington. You are represented on our board by the NAA Director, Timm Hines. The NAA Director is an appointed position, with two-year term running from 1 April to 31 March in odd years.

NAA members are eligible to participate in the Multi-Color Mail-In, the Multi-Color Championship, and the FITA Championship. The Multi-Color Championship is scheduled for 12-14 January, at three locations to minimize winter travel. The registration form is inside this issue. The FITA Championship will be registered as a FITA Qualifier event, and will be held at East County Archers' range in McCleary – the dates are 18-19 August. We hope you take advantage of these opportunities to shoot and compete close to home.

Our other State Championship tournaments (Target, Safari, Field, and 3-D) require membership in WSAA. These events all include the Freestyle Limited – Recurve shooting style in addition to the various compound categories.

This year, the NAA National Field will be hosted by Evergreen Archers in Spokane. Wildlife Committee of Washington has several FITA Qualifiers and a Star FITA on the Calendar. Several JOAD clubs are active in the state, and KBH Archers at Belfair will be hosting this year's State JOAD Championship, on 20 January. See the article inside for more info.

We welcome your involvement and efforts to provide the events and programs which support our members' goals and development.

### Washington JOAD Championship

Kitsap Hotshots will be hosting the Washington JOAD Championship on January, 20 2007. Competition will be held at KBH Archers' range in Belfair. The first session will start at 9 am and the second session will start at 11:30 am.

# TOURNAMENT COMMUNITY NEWS

## Does Your Firing or Archery Range Need Improvements?

The Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation (IAC) is pleased to announce a call for grant applications to the Firearms and Archery Range Recreation program (FARR).

FARR grants can be used to develop or renovate facilities such as rifle and archery ranges, trap and skeet fields, pistol pits, and club houses. Grants also may be used to acquire land for new ranges or to expand or increase buffers at existing ranges, buy equipment, make environmental improvements, respond to noise issues, and purchase liability protection.

IAC estimates there will be \$600,000 available for 2007 grants, triple the normal amount.

Who can apply? Cities; Counties; State Agencies; Special taxing districts; Qualified non-profit shooting organizations and clubs

Applicants must be able to provide matching resources, which generally are cash or donated labor or materials.

Since beginning in 1992, more than \$2.7 million in grants have been awarded for 74 projects around the state. FARR grants are paid for by \$3 from each concealed pistol license fee.

Applications are due May 1, 2007.

## State Seeks Volunteers for Recreation Committees

OLYMPIA—The state Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation (IAC) is looking for nine volunteers to fill vacancies on three of its advisory committees for parks, trails, wildlife lands and firearm and archery ranges.

The advisory committees make recommendations to IAC on policies, funding and statewide planning for grant programs.

### National Recreational Trails Program Advisory Committee

Three volunteers are needed to serve on the advisory committee for the National Recreational Trails Program, which provides grants to maintain backcountry trails and facilities. Generally, advisory committee members attend one weekday meeting a year and spend 10-20 hours evaluating projects for funding. When the budget allows, travel costs will be covered. One person each, representing the following points of view, is needed: Snowmobiling, four-wheeling and activities accessed by a nonhighway road such as fishing, camping, and taking nature walks. The ideal candidate has a statewide perspective in the category represented, is recognized for trail experience and is knowledgeable on trail issues. Candidates should be able to show support from those in the category represented. The appointments are through December 2010.

### Land and Water Conservation Fund Advisory Committee

Two volunteers are needed to serve on the advisory committee for the Land and Water Conservation Fund program, which provides grants to preserve and develop outdoor recreation sites including parks, trails and wildlife lands. Generally, members attend up to four weekday meetings a year. When the budget allows, travel costs will be covered. One citizen and one representative of local government are needed. Members are generally appointed for two- to four-year terms. The ideal candidate has interest in outdoor recreation, open space and habitat conservation.

### Firearms and Archery Range Recreation Advisory Committee

Four volunteers are needed to serve on the advisory committee for the Firearms and Archery Range Recreation program, which provides to firearm ranges and archery facilities. Generally, members attend up to four weekday meetings a year. Travel costs are covered. One member in each of the following fields is needed: general public with recreational sports shooting experience, hunter education experience, law enforcement experience and shotgun experience. All appointments are through December 2008. The ideal candidate has a statewide perspective in the category represented, is recognized for shooting sports experience and is knowledgeable on issues related to the specific sport. Candidates should be able to show support from those in the category represented.

## BOWHUNTER EDUCATION: Annette Crews

As we all look forward to the next hunting season you might be interested in knowing that currently states and many foreign countries require that you take the International Bowhunter Education class to hunt their lands. When you apply for an out-of-state hunt be sure to inquire about the requirements. If you apply for a tag in a state that requires the class, don't wait to see if you drew the tag before taking the opportunity to attend a class. Every year in late July we have someone who just found out that they had to have this class and then they end up traveling many miles and sometimes out of state to get the class before they go hunting, such as the two gentlemen from Nevada I taught a few years ago.

Classes are approximately ten hours, spread out over several nights or a weekend. They are taught by trained instructors with a minimum of three years of bowhunting experience, and actually most have ten years or more.

What is a typical class agenda?

Classes have field training on tree stand placement and safety, equipment handling, calling game in close, how to hunt effectively and ethically, shot placement, blood trailing, wild game identification, scouting, map reading, survival, first aid, and much more.

Every club in the state should put aside a weekend for their members to have an opportunity to attend a class in their club house or at their range. Many of the instructors would be glad to travel to wherever you are to teach a class and it would be lots of fun for the whole club!

Classes for 2007 are coming together as we look forward to another busy year. My classes will take place in February and again in June. The times and dates will be announced later; if you want to make the February class, give me a call!

I killed this 1x2 Friday, November 24, 2006 about lunch time. I saw it out the kitchen window chasing a doe and I grabbed my bow and ran for the back corner of the yard. He was just passing behind one of my field targets when he stopped to give me a down-hill shot at 30 yards. He only went about 20 yards before expiring and then it was time to get to work gutting and dragging. They sure can be clueless when they are in love!

It is hard to find places to hunt in a new state. Jane and I have been limited in the areas we have found so far and it has been frustrating finding a spot that we have confidence in. Who would have expected that I would pick up my first ever Blacktail and my first Washington kill in the woods behind my house?



## Larry Ramsey: Eastern Washington Buck

This is a photo of the buck I shot this November, while hunting in North Eastern Washington. The buck green scores approximately 148 P & Y points, and will net approximately 135 (because of broken eye guard point). I used my Matthews Switchback bow, set at 50#, with Easton Lite Speed arrows and Stinger two-blade points. The shot was 20 yards at 24 degrees.

My two hunting partners and I went over before the season, and did some scouting, and put up our tree stands. Then we went back later to hunt. The weather was cold, but with warm clothes, and hand warmers, and foot warmers I was able to sit still and stay awake most of the time.

We had a good time, and are looking forward to next year.

## DARRINGTON ARCHERS Outdoor Nationals 2007

Mark the date to attend the NFAA Outdoor Nationals at Darrington Washington, 23-27 July 2007. The Club, the Town, and the Archers of Washington are gearing up to make this a great experience and fun for the whole family!

Darrington Archers' five ranges offer a variety of challenges and opportunities. The Dylan range is designed for handicapped access, so even those archers in wheel-chairs or scooters can experience a regular 28-target course. This course is also "spectator friendly", with central access to allow press or visitors to observe the event from the trail. The additional ranges wind up and down hills through heavy timber.

A unique aspect of the event at Darrington is the accommodations. Many of your fellow archers will be camping, in tents, trailers, or motor homes. We have lots of camping space available on the school grounds, directly adjacent to the range. There are no hook-ups, but showers are available in the gymnasium locker rooms. For dining during the event, lunch, beverages and snacks will be available on

the courses. We will plan dinners, either buffet or picnic style, on some of the shooting days to make your evening easy. Also, remember the Barebow Fraternity Picnic on Thursday night. All archers who shoot without sights (barebow, bowhunter, or traditional) are invited.

There is a lot to see and do in the Darrington area. If you are arriving in the area early, there is the Firecracker 3-D event on the previous weekend, 21-22 July, at Wilderness Archery in Bow Washington. For those who haven't had enough after five or more days of shooting, you could take in the Bownanza 3-D at Cedar River Bowmen in Black Diamond Washington the 28-29 July before heading home.

Aside from the shooting, there are great opportunities to sample some of the beautiful Northwest scenery and a little of the adventure. Hiking, river rafting, and fishing are just some of the possibilities. Additionally, there are family activities such as a petting zoo, farm tours, and plant nurseries. ## Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife News

### Plan Calls for Expanding Hunting to Reduce Mount St. Helens Elk Herd

OLYMPIA – The Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW) today released a new management plan for the Mount St. Helens elk herd that calls for expanding hunting options to reduce the size of the herd, currently estimated at 12,500 animals.

Citing the declining availability of forage in the area, the five-year plan supports gradually reducing the state's largest elk herd to about 10,000 animals to bring it into line with the "carrying capacity" of its range in southwest Washington.

"All evidence points to the fact that this herd is being strained by loss of forage due to changes in timber practices and other factors," said Dave Ware, WDFW game manager. "The new management plan recognizes that the area's habitat cannot adequately support that many elk."

Ware noted that at least 400 elk have already gathered in the mudflow area at the foot of Mount St. Helens, where more than 60 elk died of malnutrition and related causes last winter. WDFW has scheduled a hunt, by special permit only, for disabled hunters in that area Dec. 11, and is planning additional hunts in other areas of the herd's five-county range next year.

The management plan, which incorporates suggestions made during a series of public meetings last summer, also calls for:

- Continued monitoring the health of elk wintering in the Loo-Wit game management unit and the Mount St. Helens Wildlife Area.
- Collaboration with the U.S. Forest Service and other landowners to improve elk habitat throughout the herd's range in Clark, Cowlitz, Klickitat, Lewis and Skamania counties.
- New strategies for reducing impacts by elk to forestlands, farms and pastures.

Consistent with the plan, new hunting opportunities will focus on cow elk to reduce the herd's rate of reproduction, Ware said.

"A lot will depend on the willingness of timber companies and other large landowners to allow hunters onto their lands," Ware said. "We know some landowners are concerned about damage caused by elk, and opening their gates to hunters will help address that problem."

The management plan does not rule out winter feeding of elk to prevent starvation, although it cautions that the practice can concentrate elk around feed sites, spread diseases and parasites, damage vegetation and permanently change elk behavior.

The Mount St. Helens elk herd is one of 10 elk herds in Washington State. Since 2001, WDFW has completed separate management plans for seven of those herds to supplement management policies outlined in the statewide Game Management Plan.

### Commission Expands Bird Testing for Avian Influenza

TUMWATER – To protect public health and Northwest bird populations, the Washington Fish and Wildlife Commission has adopted a rule requiring game-bird farmers to test their flocks for avian influenza at least once a year.

The commission, which sets policy for the Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW), approved the bird-testing rule during a public meeting in Tumwater December 8-9.

The new rule, developed by WDFW in cooperation with the Washington Department of Agriculture, requires approximately 80 game farms raising game birds and waterfowl in Washington state to annually test 10 percent of their flock – up to a maximum of 30 birds. Testing at the game farms was previously conducted on a voluntary basis.

Earlier this year, WDFW began testing hunter-harvested and free-flying birds for avian influenza, said Dave Ware, game manager for WDFW. The testing, which focuses on shorebird and waterfowl species vulnerable to avian influenza, is part of a national surveillance effort.

Although the strain of avian influenza transmissible to humans has not been found in North America, other strains of the virus have been found in wild birds, Ware said.

"With hundreds of thousands of migratory waterfowl and shorebirds passing through Washington each year, it's important that we expand the monitoring effort for avian influenza to include game-bird farms in this state," said Ron Ozment, chairman of the commission.

In other action, the nine-member commission:

- Modified the boundaries of an elk-hunting area, and created a Pumice Plain Elk Area near Mount St. Helens and a Methow Deer Area in the Methow Valley.
- Expanded hunting opportunities through landowner hunting permits on private ranches in Grant and Asotin counties.
- Adopted spring bear hunting seasons for 2007-09, including a new permit hunt in the Copalis unit.
- Increased the number of moose raffle permits from one to two in 2007.

Commissioners also heard briefings on a variety of other issues, including the Private Lands Access Program.

# WSAA Indoor Blueface Mail-in Championship Rules

## GENERAL

1. The Indoor Blueface Mail-in Championship will consist of six rounds, usually shot over a period of six weeks. Registered archers may submit scores shot on / after 1 February 2007. Deadline for registration is 15 February 2007. All forms and fees must be postmarked by this date. All Scores are due 31 March 2007.
2. Each shooting group shall select a tournament reporter. The Location Reporter must mail scores to the Tournament Vice President each week. The Tournament Vice President will tabulate scores and send a summary to each location reporter.
3. The distance shot will be 20 yards, using the NFAA-type indoor round blue face target, or NFAA-type multi-spot blue face. Cubs and PeeWees shall shoot at 10 yards. The round shot consists of 12 ends of 5 arrows each, total 60 arrows.
5. DIVISIONS:
  - Individual -- All NFAA Divisions and Styles are recognized, including PeeWee, no Crossbows
  - Team
    - Limited – Any fingers style (FSL, BB, BH, BHFSL, Traditional, FSL Recurve) and any age.
    - Unlimited -- Any style and any age.
    - Bowhunter Freestyle -- Any fixed-pin style and any age.
    - Junior Team -- Any style and any age under 18.
6. All state residents must be current WSAA members. New members will be permitted to join WSAA prior to the start of the tournament. To determine the proper age group for this tournament, use the junior's age at the start of the tournament.
7. Out of state shooters are welcome to compete in this tournament. They must be members of their own state or province archery association or the WSAA. If not a member of NFAA, enclose a copy of your membership card with Registration.
12. A team shall consist of three to six members from the same shooting location. Team registration fee is \$15 per team (in addition to the individual registration). The weekly team score will be the total of the top three team members.
14. Adult teams may consist of both men and women. Junior teams of both boys and girls. A finger shooter may shoot on an unlimited team but a release shooter may not shoot on a finger team.
15. A sample scorecard will be provided by the Tournament Vice President. All scoring must be double scoring. One score card will be retained by the location recorder and one mailed to the Tournament Vice President. All scorecards must be signed by the individual archer and the two WSAA witnesses. (Three different signatures are required.) All juniors shooting shall be supervised and their scorecards signed by an adult.

## SHOOTING RULES

1. Equipment Rules: Follow NFAA Equipment Rules.
2. A line captain shall be selected and shall settle all doubtful issues pertaining to shooting and scoring.
3. Each contestant must declare before shooting begins that he/she is shooting for WSAA Mail-in official score. (A contestant may not shoot two or more rounds and then use the best overall scores.)
4. There will be two official practice ends consisting of five arrows each.
5. The round will be shot on the NFAA Blueface target (individual's choice of single-spot or five-spot)
  - a. An end shall be composed of 5 arrows, 4 ends shall be a game.
  - b. There shall be a 4-minute time limit to shoot an end.
  - c. The round shall be composed of 12 ends -3 games.
  - d. The archer will shoot their assigned target. If assigned to an upper target, the archer will shoot the upper target for the first six ends, then rotate to shoot the lower for the remaining six ends, and vice-versa.
6.
  - a. Scoring area values for the single-spot face shall be 5-4-3-2-1.
  - b. The white line that separates the scoring areas shall be entirely in the higher scoring area.
  - c. If shooting the five-spot face, score the white spot 5, the blue rings 4.
  - d. X rings shall be counted and used as tie breakers, and will be considered part of the official score.
  - e. Scorer shall record Xs and numeric value of each arrow on the scorecard.
7. No archer may advance in front of the shooting line during normal shooting periods for ANY reason. Any archer shooting prior to beginning whistle or after whistle signaling end will lose the highest scoring arrow or arrows equaling the number of discrepant arrows shot.
8. In case of equipment failure, verified by the line captain, the archer shall have fifteen minutes to make repairs, without holding up the tournament. Backup bows may be used.
  - a. The archer shall be given one end (five arrows) for the purpose of resighting.
  - b. Makeup arrows will be shot at the end of the round in the presence of the Line Captain.
  - c. This occurrence of repair or replacement may not happen more than once in a tournament day.
9. In case of major equipment failure which cannot be repaired in the time allowed, an archer may suspend shooting and continue the round at a later date. Either repaired or replaced equipment may be used.
  - a. Scorecards will be retained by the location reporter until the round is completed.
  - b. Makeup round will be shot in the presence of the Line Captain.
  - c. This occurrence of suspending and continuing shooting may not happen more than once in the six-round series.
  - d. This option applies to the Mail-In tournament ONLY.
10. When an arrow is dropped while the archer is in the act of shooting he may shoot another arrow in place of the dropped arrow if any part of the arrow is within ten feet of the shooting line. (A dropped arrow is one which falls while being transferred from the quiver to be nocked on the string, or on preparation for a shot, or which falls from the string during a controlled letdown.)
11. The line captain will make all decisions on scoring questionable arrows, and their decisions are final.
  - a. All scoring shall be completed before an arrow in the target face, or the target face itself, may be touched.
  - b. Witnessed bounce-outs or arrows passing completely through the target butt will be reshot at the end of the round, in the presence of the Line Captain.
  - c. If an archer shoots more than five arrows in an end, only the five arrows of lower value may be scored. A penalty of one point will be assessed for each arrow shot over the prescribed number of arrows.
  - d. Hits on the wrong target will be scored as misses.
  - e. If an archer shoots less than five arrows in one end he may shoot his remaining arrows if the omission is discovered before the end is officially completed, otherwise, they shall be scored as misses.
  - f. If using the five spot target face, an archer may shoot any of the five target spots in any order and shoot as many arrows into any spot as the archer desires, not to exceed the prescribed number of arrows per end.
12. Bowhunter Freestyle and Bowhunter Freestyle Limited competitors may NOT adjust their pin sights during a round.
13. Any registered shooters must complete all six rounds to be eligible for awards for individual or teams.
14. Winner is the archer with the highest total score. In the event of a tie, the individual registering the most X rings shall be declared the winner. If there should still be a tie, the participants shall be declared tied and equal awards shall be given regardless of unit rule. However, other places shall be adjusted to reflect the awards given according to unit rule and unit rule will only be broken to award duplicate awards to the last place allowable by unit rule.
15. Any rules not covered above shall be referred to the Tournament Committee.
16. Any grievances must be presented in writing to the Tournament Committee, and must be accompanied by a \$25.00 fee.
