## Northwest Triple Crown Buckle Shoot

This year the Northwest Washington 3-D Triple Crown Brass Buckle Series ended on February 24, 2008. We had 46 participants entered in 18 categories. The largest of these categories was Adult Male Bowhunter Freestyle with 16 shooters. There were 11 cubs and peewees entered in several different divisions. Female shooters comprised 28% of the entries.

January 27 was the day for the first leg of the series, the Early Bird 3-D, held at Silver Arrow Bowmen, Mt Vernon, WA. There the archers were met with wonderful shooting weather. It was not too warm or too cold and the wind was minimal. Great weather conditions for the end of January. Uphill and down they shot 30 targets in all. It was a successful beginning to the series.

The second day leg of the competition was held February 10 near Oak Harbor, WA at the Whidbey Island Bowmen Frozen Slug 3-D. Again, the weather cooperated. We even saw some sun breaks during the shoot. There were 32 targets to challenge the archer's skill. Many of the scores improved with the additional two targets; some did not.

During the third leg, held at Wilderness Archery and Taxidermy, Bow, WA, we shot 30 targets again in near perfect weather. Some exceptional scores were shot considering the number of targets. There were several in the 290s including some from our smaller shooters. At the end of the shoot, the winners were presented with Northwest Washington 3-D Triple Crown Brass Belt Buckles. While not all categories ended up with winners, 14 buckles were presented at the ceremony.

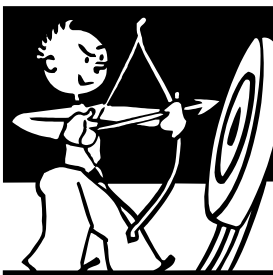

Another sure sign is that the Blueface Championship is in the history books, thus ends the indoor season, put away the fat shafts and get skinny for field shooting. I do not have the figures on total shooters and how they stack up to last years, but Eastside numbers were up. I shot at AS&J in Yakima and had a great time, got to see friends and chat with most of the shooters. So many archers seem to miss the social aspect of archery and only concentrate solely on the score, gotta be missing a lot of fun. I was glad to see the results of Saturday's West side on the table on Sunday morning, knowing the communication between sites was working. My hats off to Tim

Davis and crew for getting the final results posted on the website as quick as he could. I received a number of e-mails wanting to know what was taking so long, it is a volunteer organization after all and Tim wanted all score cards in hand to verify accuracy and make sure archers were in the correct styles and divisions. Great plan!

Next up is the Washington State NASP Championship (Wolf Cup) in East Wenatchee at Clovis Point Middle School. East Wenatchee is on the North side of the Columbia River, Wenatchee proper is on the South side of the river, very easy to get to and you should not have any problem at all coming and helping. The NASP coordinators are busy with the logistics of the shoot and arranging all the equipment needed. I know for fact that we need more bodies, we will have about 200 shooters and need 2-adults for each target to assist with scoring. We had about 20 targets for each line last year so that is 40 adults, we use the parents as much as we can but having experience at filling out score cards is a big plus. I can guarantee that you will come away from the day all jazzed up by the kids energy and want to do more. If you can help please send Dave Mack or Linda Parker an e-mail or do it the hard way and make a phone call, but do not delay do it.

One week after the NASP tournament, head your cars East again to the Target Championship in Spokane, hosted by Evergreen Archers. Evergreen is partnering with Spokane Valley Archery and will hold the tourney on SVA's flat range practice area. This is a new experience for SVA and looks to be a great spot to shoot and will introduce the American 900 round to a bunch of young archers. SVA has a JOAD program but has not had a tournament for the students. Look for directions to SVA on the WSAA website under charter shops, or do a map quest, the range is 5 miles South from the Sullivan Rd exit off of I-90. Before or after shooting check out the area's newest addition of Cabela's in Post Falls, Idaho, about 10 miles to the East on I-90. Or arrange to shoot 14 field at SVA's field range. If you have not sent in your pre-registration form please call Ed at 509-238-4748 and let him know you are coming.

Ray Crisp has built an awesome chat Forum on the WSAA website, the forum has five main interest areas, GENERAL, HUNTING, TOURNAMENT, BOARD OF DIRECTORS AND NASP. Whatever interests you and your curiosity is intrigued check it out. It only takes about 5- minutes initially to register and get onboard. It is a great way to communicate on issues and WSAA business. The Board will be conducting business as needed with the forum. Post your clubs shoot info, results or a shoot coming up, discuss hunting issues and get other views, ask about tournament rules, the list is endless and very quick and easy to do. You can also click a button to receive e-mail notices regarding a posted reply to an issue. Most of the Board is already registered and you will be hearing from me if you have not yet, please don't wait for my call get it done. Please get involved and find out quickly what is going on.

Last month I had asked for anyone having grant writing experience and some time to donate to call, several members have called and offered to help. But we still need a person who might have some time and knowledge about applying to the IRS for a 501C3 status for NASP Washington State. If you are experienced in either of these area or know of someone who is, please call or send me a note.

## 2008 FITA Field Nationals and World Team Trials

The FITA Field nationals and World Team Trials will be held in at Evergreen Archers in Spokane June 6-8. The Evergreen Archers have taken a challenging round, wicked tough terrain and a strong partnership with the City to build what has become an International event.

Most of you probably haven't shot FITA Field before but most of you have probably tried 3D and NFAA field. FITA Field is a game that combines the challenges of both into one round. The competition is held over two days and is shot on an all black face with a gold center. The first day is 24 unmarked distance targets and the second day is 24 marked targets – all in meters. The target is scored 6 points for the X ring, 5 for the rest of the gold and progressively 4-3-2-1 for each scoring ring.

One of the most common questions I get about FITA Field is about the unmarked portion. Unlike 3D it is actually accepted practice to "bracket" range the targets. So the top shooters all develop a "system" where they use the distance between the scope housing and the center to gauge the distance of the target, often drawing and letting down two or three times to get the yardage right. Once you have a system – even a basic system –



you are in business. My first FITA Field was in 2005 while I still lived in Minnesota. I asked a few questions on the internet on how to do it and decided to create a system where I used the lines on my level to memorize what each size target looked like at five-meter increments. It was pretty poor compared to some systems but I was able to use it to finish second in the unmarked and place third for the nationals.

One of the things that make Spokane and Evergreen such a well loved location is the terrain and the creativity of the range master, Jim Cowgill who whips up some of the toughest and most picturesque shots you will ever shoot. Every round you can expect to find some 30 degree uphill and downhill shots, some side hills and some frustratingly close birdie targets (small in-line 3-spot targets) that will challenge you to find marks on your sight tape that don't exist! Even though they are only 10 meters or so away, you may find yourself shooting off the tape to get that elusive X!

## Bowhunter Education

By now all of you who are going to book an "out of state or out of the country" hunt know by now as most of the sports shows are over with.

If you're planning on hunting any of these places you may be required to take a Bowhunter Education Class so you may need to check with them and don't wait! Alaska, Connecticut, Idaho, Kansas, Louisiana, Main, Montana, Nebraska, New Brunswick, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Nova Scotia, Quebec, Rhode Island, South Dakota, and Vermont. There may be more States and Countries being added to the list as laws change.

Almost every day I have contact with a hunter in a panic because he or she wasn't told about the required class at the time they booked the hunt. It is your responsibility to know they'll

say. So if you're going on a Spring Bear hunt somewhere you need to get the class ASAP. If not, you might want to take the class to have it out of your way for when you do have an opportunity to travel to hunt. Our state doesn't require the class for archery hunters and if we do a good job of teaching our fellow archers good hunting ethics, we may never need to have the class as a requirement in this state.

We are looking to get instructors for the East side of Washington, so if you want to share your passion for archery hunting with others please give us a call!

## Redesigned Master Hunter Program Accepting Applications through April 16

OLYMPIA — The Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW) is currently accepting enrollment applications through April 16 for its redesigned Master Hunter program.

An orientation meeting on the application and certification process will be held March 22, from 1 to 4 p.m., in Room 172 of the Natural Resources Building (NRB), 1111 Washington St., Olympia. Details on the program and enrollment procedures are available at <http://wdfw.wa.gov/hunting/masterhunter/>.

Formerly known as Advanced Hunter Education (AHE), the program was revamped in 2007 to redefine its purpose and clarify requirements for participation. Enrollment in the program was suspended for nine months until the redesign was completed.

Master hunters participate in controlled hunts to remove problem animals that damage property or threaten public safety. To qualify for the program, applicants must demonstrate a high level of skill and be committed to lawful and ethical hunting practices, said Bruce Bjork, chief of the WDFW Enforcement program that manages hunter education.

“Since the beginning, the purpose of the program was to create a pool of highly qualified hunters who could help the department manage wildlife in sensitive or problem areas,” Bjork said. “Over the years, the effort has been largely successful, with problem animals removed from damage situations and millions of dollars saved in crop damage.”

But the program was not without its problems, which led to the recent overhaul, Bjork said.

“Some people took advantage of the privilege and were hunting illegally, which damaged the reputation of the program and defeated its purpose,” he said. “It was clear we needed a new direction to attract people who not only had the skills, but were committed to ethical and responsible hunting.”

As part of that new direction, hunters enrolling in the program are now required to undergo a criminal background check and sign a Master Hunter Code of Ethics. New applicants will also be required to provide at least 20 hours of volunteer service on projects that benefit the state's wildlife resources.

Those who successfully complete the enrollment process will receive a certificate, a patch and a master hunter identification card and will be eligible to participate in special predation hunts throughout the year.

Former AHE members also must comply with the new regulations to be considered for retention in the new program. Those who turned in their forms will be notified by May 12 on their certification status.

“This is a great opportunity for conscientious, committed hunters to assume a leadership role among their peers,” Bjork said. “Their knowledge and conduct in the field can help build positive relationships with landowners and assure public hunting opportunity in the future.”

Along with the new requirements, a Master Hunter advisory group is also being formed to help guide the department's efforts, provide oversight and help improve the effectiveness of program.

Changes in the Master Hunter program do not affect WDFW's Basic Hunter Education program. Washington hunters born after January 1, 1972 are required to complete Basic Hunter Education in order to purchase a valid hunting license.

**The "grave yard shot" that caused a lot of people to scratch their heads. It was about 18m downhill but at such a steep angle it was shot for closer to 10m.**

This year the event is a bit special because every two years the NAA picks the top three archers in each division to represent the US at the world championships. This year that will be held in Llwynypia, Wales, Great Britain. Because the NAA rotates the Nationals and World Team Trials, this will likely be the last time for at least two years that we will be able to have this unique and challenging round so close to home and I urge you to consider signing up for this event if nothing else for the experience of shooting one of the most challenging and fun rounds in archery!

## WILDLIFE COMMITTEE: Outdoor Target Archery

In 2008 the Wildlife Committee of Washington (WCW) will host five weekends of outdoor target archery at

our Kenmore range. FITA tournaments using National Archery Association rules and FITA format will be shot on Saturdays, followed on Sundays by a 70m Round and head-to-head Olympic Rounds. On Sundays we will also shoot a 900-Round in meters.

The weekends this year are: April 26 & 27; May 31 & June 1; July 12 & 13; August 23 & 24 and September 13 & 14.

Our featured tournament is the WCW Star FITA on Saturday, July 12, during WCW's Big Game 3-D.

All FITA tournaments and 70m Rounds are registered as qualifying events with the National Archery Association.

On both days practice ends will be shot from 9 – 9:45 am. First arrow for score: 10 am.

A FITA match consists of 144 arrows shot at four distances. Men shoot 90m, 70m, 50m and 30m. Women shoot 70m, 60m, 50m and 30m. Younger archers shoot shorter kid-friendly distances. The peak draw weight for compound bows cannot exceed 60 pounds.

Lastly, to shoot 2 days for score puts another challenge on the young archers.

The Easton Jags Archery team, consisting of 36 team members, is now preparing for their journey to the third Annual State NASP Championship to be held on April 12<sup>th</sup> in Wenatchee.

The distance shot is 18 meters, using the multi-color 40 cm. indoor target, or three-spot target face. PeeWees shoot at 9 meters. The round shot consists of 10 ends of 3 arrows each, total 30 arrows

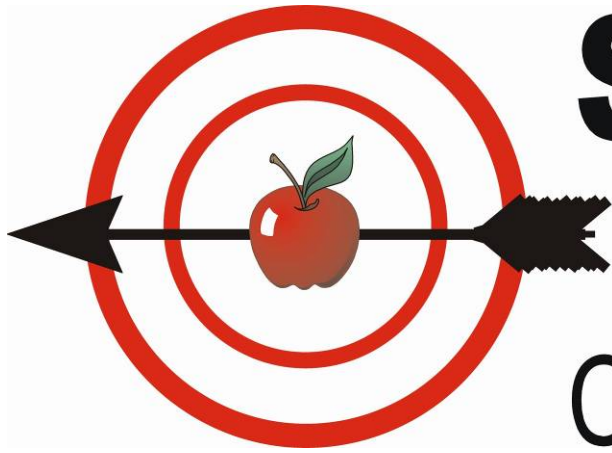
