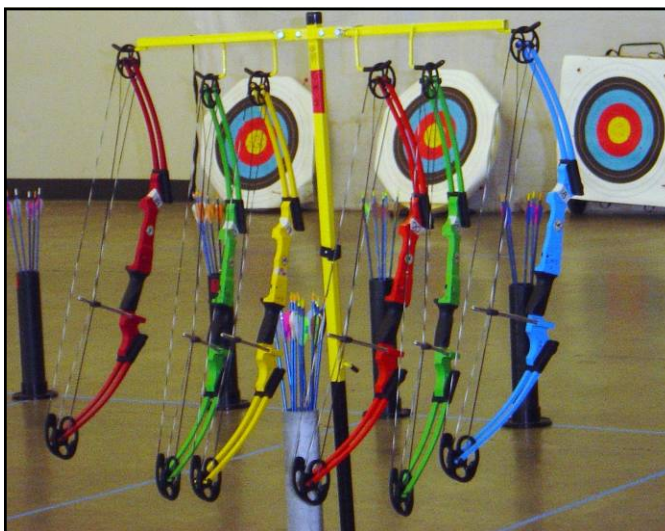

St Thomas More Camp:

On October 9 & 10 three WSAA members / Instructors Dave Mack Jim Cowgill and Ed Forslof traveled to Camp Wooten on the Tucannon river near Pomeroy (Blue Mountains), and spent two glorious days with some very great kids and teachers. St Thomas More School in Spokane takes their entire 6th, 7th and 8th grades to a week-long camp, for outdoor event education. Ray Wilson WSAA past President was contacted by the school five-years ago to teach archery on two of the four days the kids are in camp, and we have been accepted as the greatest thing since sliced bread.

The camp has had several homes during the four years that WSAA has been involved and has a nickname now of "Camp where ya gonna go". The original home for two years was at the Camp Wooten Environmental Learning Center on the Tucannon river near Pomeroy. Forest fires licking up to the doorsteps of the Camp the last two years meant finding temporary homes for the camp. Last year the camp was held at the Boy Scout Camp Fife, on the Naches River, what a beautiful location and facility.

This year no fires, so the camp came home to Camp Wooten. We had a covered shooting line and actual Archery range, St Thomas More supplied target butts and bows they have purchased for the NASP Program held in their school, and the shooting began. The students were divided up into ten groups of nine students each; each group has an 8th grade leader who is responsible for getting the group from one activity to the next for the duration of the camp. It is a great concept that works very very well. So one by one the groups descended on us for about an hour of time each. The horn would sound and all would moan "no not yet". We used concepts from the NASP program for introducing the instruction, and what a team we became, one very well oiled machine.

Each student carries a large binder with them throughout the camp, with a schedule of every minute laid out, included in the binder are pages for each activity with a grading system of colored stickers. A blue or green is the best and worth the max points with red the bottom and worth only one point. The grading is primarily for attitude, attention and participation, with each group competing to collect the most points. I am happy to say we only awarded blue stickers and occasionally double stickers.

I must add that working with Jim and Dave was a great way to spend two days in a beautiful location, what a great pair of friends. We were bunked with the cook, got to tell you four-adult men in a very small cabin can raise the rafters snoring; first one to sleep got to sleep. We were fed and housed by the camp and I am sure we came away a few pounds heavier, great food, good friends and wonderful kids.

I couldn’t stand just watching her, so I started shooting the indoor leagues as well and learned that it was challenging, fun, and good practice for hunting. Then, by chance, I went to a State Field shoot, just to see what it was all about. I knew nothing of the scoring or rules, but the other shooters were supportive and helpful and they got me through the weekend. I was encouraged to go to Nationals at Darrington that year. I had a BLAST and was then hooked on field archery. After that, I have become a regular at state and national championships, where I have met my wonderful archery friends. I always look forward to going to shoots so that I can catch up with friends from our state and across the country.

I would like to thank Ben LaPointe for all his hard work as Tournament VP. He has done a great job and I hope that I can fill the shoes he has left for me. I am looking forward to serving in this position and ask for input from my fellow archers as to how we can make archery in our state the BEST. As the new tournament VP, I would like to encourage all of you to try a different venue other than your normal shoots and meet some new friends that share your same passion, ARCHERY.

FITA is Preparing for the Youth Olympic Games

In the summer 2010 the IOC will organize the first Youth Olympic Games. The objective is to get together about 3500 young and talented athletes aged between 14 and 18 years old. Most of the Summer International Federations are involved in the 2010 edition of the YOG. As it is the case for the Olympic Games, winter editions of the YOG will also take place, based on the same format of the Olympics.

FITA has been among the first International Federation to react to the IOC call. An Ad Hoc commission has been created and the collaboration with the IOC Sports Department is important.

One of the most important changes for Archery is the rotation of the Youth World Championships from even to odd years. As a result, a transition system had to be found especially in relation with the European Championships which alternate with FITA. FITA will not organize a World Indoor Championships in 2011 but only in 2012. There will be however two consecutive European Indoor Championships in 2010 and 2011.

With the goal to present an attractive competition format for a limited number of athletes, FITA is proposing a five days competition with 32 boys and 32 girls participating. A ranking round at 70m will take place on the first day, with eliminations and Olympic Round Finals on days 3, 4 and 5. The second day will be dedicated to a mixed team competition, one girl and one boy, in match format (1/8, 1/4, 1/2, bronze and gold).

The IOC also wishes young officials and young technical experts to take part in the competitions. FITA would like to propose 13 International Judges, acting under the responsibility of the Judges Committee: seven judges being under 42 years old and six being between 18 and 25 years old. These judges would be specially trained for this event and would be a good asset for the future of our sport.

The IOC wishes the Youth Olympic Games to be a return to the origin of the Olympic Games spirit. The Cultural and Sportive dimension of the Games will be important as well as the image of Fair-Play.

The Archery Family understands the importance of such an event for the future of our sport. Together we are preparing for new, exciting project.

FITA Council was informed on the progress of the Youth Olympic Games and FITA is continuing to prepare for these Games. The Youth World Championships that will qualify for the first edition will be held in Salt Lake City, USA pending the finalization of the bid that was received. The qualification process will now be finalized in cooperation with the IOC and it is expected to be very similar with the Olympic Qualification system.

Commission Approves Partial Package of Public-Conduct Rules for Department Lands

PORT ANGELES – At a public meeting here in December, the Washington Fish and Wildlife Commission approved a package of new rules for public conduct on lands managed by the Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW) and deferred action on others.

The proposed rules, developed by WDFW after an extensive public-input process, addressed dumping, camping, commercial use, fire-building, firearm use and other activities on WDFW wildlife areas and water-access sites around the state. The rules will go into effect by January 31, 2008.

The nine-member commission, which sets policy for WDFW, deferred action on three rules dealing with livestock grazing, resource removal and vehicle use. The commission requested initiation of a new rule-making process to further revise those rules and gather additional public input.

In the interim, the current state regulations pertaining to livestock grazing, resource removal and vehicle use on department lands remain in effect.

The commission also voted to:

- Add two new spring bear hunts on managed timberlands in Whatcom, Snohomish and Skagit counties.
- Provide multi-season hunting permits as incentives to recruit and retain hunter education instructors.
- Reduce turkey raffles permits from two to one; expand eastern Washington deer auctions and raffles from one to two.
- Change and extend several designated deer and elk areas along with the development of additional areas to increase recreational opportunities.
- Acquire 516 acres in Klickitat County and lease two .13-acre sites in Grant and Yakima counties.
- Add a new non-toxic shot requirement for hunting at the Chinook pheasant release site in Pacific County.
- Approve a master hunter policy that outlines stronger accountability standards and improvements to the Master Hunter Program and provides for the development of a comprehensive road management program.

In other business, the commission was briefed on a new rule that would strengthen certification requirements for people enrolling in the Master Hunter Program (formerly known as the Advanced Hunter Education Program). The new rule also would allow WDFW to suspend participation in the program for unethical or unlawful behavior. Final adoption of the Master Hunter Program rules will be considered at the commission's Jan. 10-12 meeting.

The commission was also briefed on a recommendation to reclassify the status of the bald eagle in Washington State from threatened to sensitive.

At the meeting, the commission also formalized the WDFW director's goals and objectives for the remainder of the biennium.

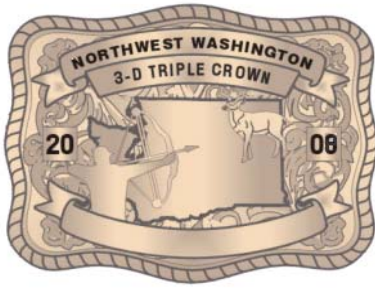

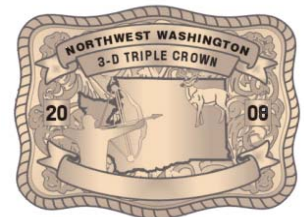

SHOOTING RULES

1. Equipment Rules: Follow NFAA Equipment Rules.
2. A line captain shall be selected and shall settle all doubtful issues pertaining to shooting and scoring.
3. Each contestant must declare before shooting begins that he/she is shooting for WSAA Mail-in official score. (A contestant may not shoot two or more rounds and then use the best overall scores.)
4. There will be two official practice ends consisting of five arrows each.
5. The round will be shot on the NFAA Blueface target (individual's choice of single-spot or five-spot)
 - a. An end shall be composed of 5 arrows, 4 ends shall be a game.
 - b. There shall be a 4-minute time limit to shoot an end.
 - c. The round shall be composed of 12 ends -3 games.
 - d. The archer will shoot their assigned target. If assigned to an upper target, the archer will shoot the upper target for the first six ends, then rotate to shoot the lower for the remaining six ends, and vice-versa.
6.
 - a. Scoring area values for the single-spot face shall be 5-4-3-2-1.
 - b. The white line that separates the scoring areas shall be entirely in the higher scoring area.
 - c. If shooting the five-spot face, score the white spot 5, the blue rings 4.
 - d. X rings shall be counted and used as tie breakers, and will be considered part of the official score.
 - e. Scorer shall record Xs and numeric value of each arrow on the scorecard.
7. No archer may advance in front of the shooting line during normal shooting periods for ANY reason. Any archer shooting prior to beginning whistle or after whistle signaling end will lose the highest scoring arrow or arrows equaling the number of discrepant arrows shot.
8. In case of equipment failure, verified by the line captain, the archer shall have fifteen minutes to make repairs, without holding up the tournament. Backup bows may be used.
 - a. The archer shall be given one end (five arrows) for the purpose of resighting.
 - b. Makeup arrows will be shot at the end of the round in the presence of the Line Captain.
 - c. This occurrence of repair or replacement may not happen more than once in a tournament day.
9. In case of major equipment failure which cannot be repaired in the time allowed, an archer may suspend shooting and continue the round at a later date. Either repaired or replaced equipment may be used.
 - a. Scorecards will be retained by the location reporter until the round is completed.
 - b. Makeup round will be shot in the presence of the Line Captain.
 - c. This occurrence of suspending and continuing shooting may not happen more than once in the six-round series.
 - d. This option applies to the Mail-In tournament ONLY.
10. When an arrow is dropped while the archer is in the act of shooting he may shoot another arrow in place of the dropped arrow if any part of the arrow is within ten feet of the shooting line. (A dropped arrow is one which falls while being transferred from the quiver to be nocked on the string, or on preparation for a shot, or which falls from the string during a controlled letdown.)
11. The line captain will make all decisions on scoring questionable arrows, and their decisions are final.
 - a. All scoring shall be completed before an arrow in the target face, or the target face itself, may be touched.
 - b. Witnessed bounce-outs or arrows passing completely through the target butt will be reshot at the end of the round, in the presence of the Line Captain.
 - c. If an archer shoots more than five arrows in an end, only the five arrows of lower value may be scored. A penalty of one point will be assessed for each arrow shot over the prescribed number of arrows.
 - d. Hits on the wrong target will be scored as misses.
 - e. If an archer shoots less than five arrows in one end he may shoot his remaining arrows if the omission is discovered before the end is officially completed, otherwise, they shall be scored as misses.
 - f. If using the five spot target face, an archer may shoot any of the five target spots in any order and shoot as many arrows into any spot as the archer desires, not to exceed the prescribed number of arrows per end.
12. Bowhunter Freestyle and Bowhunter Freestyle Limited competitors may NOT adjust their pin sights during a round.
13. Any registered shooters must complete all six rounds to be eligible for awards for individual or teams.
14. Winner is the archer with the highest total score. In the event of a tie, the individual registering the most X rings shall be declared the winner. If there should still be a tie, the participants shall be declared tied and equal awards shall be given regardless of unit rule. However, other places shall be adjusted to reflect the awards given according to unit rule and unit rule will only be broken to award duplicate awards to the last place allowable by unit rule.
15. Any rules not covered above shall be referred to the Tournament Committee.
16. Any grievances must be presented in writing to the Tournament Committee, and must be accompanied by a \$25.00 fee.

NAA INDOOR FORMAT

Recurve Bow - Two rounds of 60 arrows (120 total) at a 40 cm target face (choice of single-spot or triple-spot face) from 18 meters with outer ten-ring scoring.

Compound Bow - Two rounds of 60 arrows (120 total) at a 40 cm target face (choice of single-spot or triple-spot face) from 18 meters with inner ten-ring scoring.

MEMBERSHIP - NAA or NFAA Membership is required for all competitors. Membership in a JOAD Club is also required for the JOAD Indoors. NFAA members must enclose a copy of their current (through March, 2008) membership card, with their tournament Registration Form. If your NAA membership expires prior to the official start date of the tournament, your NAA membership renewal must accompany your tournament Registration Form. Your application will not be considered complete until your current membership is on file. Please be prepared to show NAA or NFAA membership card at the tournament registration table or be prepared to purchase a NAA membership at that time.

ENTERING MORE THAN ONE CLASS - An archer may compete in more than one discipline (i.e., Compound or Recurve), but may not compete in more than one age category within the same discipline. Separate fees and a separate Registration Form are required for each discipline in which an archer shoots.

WHERE TO ENTER: Participants may compete at any one of the above locations (or at any of the locations in other regions). Residents of each region will have registration priority should any one location reach full capacity.
