## Winter 2009 Archery Instructor Training

Washington's NASP Core is conducting a series of Basic Archery Instructor (BAI) courses around the state. The first session was held on February 13, at Sterling Intermediate School in East Wenatchee, with Linda Parker, Sherrie Crisp, Dave Mack, and Ed Forslof instructing. This was quickly followed by a class at St George School, Spokane, on February 21. Two additional classes are on the schedule: March 7 at The Overlake School in Redmond, and March 14 at Chief Joseph School in Richland.

The BAI is a very full agenda and a hands-on opportunity to work with the same equipment and coaching techniques that the NASP teachers will be using in the classroom. The training is also appropriate for anyone who wants to introduce archery to beginners using a proven safe and effective method, or those who will be supporting a NASP school in their community.

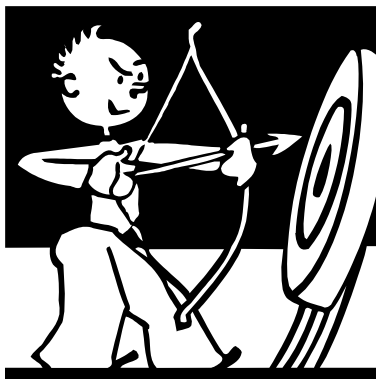

## WSAA PRESIDENT: Ed Forslof



Still two feet of snow on the ground here in winterland, but hey we can turn up the heat and shoot indoors.

At the Convention in October 2008 in Yakima the Board of Directors approved a motion to proceed with applying to IRS to change our tax status to 501(c)(3). The delegates assembled at the Convention were briefed on the decision.

This issue of the Quiver contains the Committee's recommended changes to the Constitution and By-Laws, allowing WSAA to apply for IRS 501(c)(3) status. The amendments are aimed at changing how the WSAA Board is configured. There are no new positions on the Board or how the positions are elected. The main change is to establish an Executive Board from within the existing Board, and allowing one Trustee at Large to be elected on the ballot with the President, Executive VP, Tournament VP and Hunting VP. All other positions will be elected as normal. Establishing an Executive Board will present WSAA in a better view to charitable foundations. Our goal for all of

this is to begin searching for and writing grants to help fund NASP and other programs for WSAA.

The Board of Directors has moved and approved of this method to present to the membership the proposed changes. Included in this newsletter is the proposal being presented? Please review with your Club and be ready for the ballot .

All clubs will receive a proposal and ballot by registered mail, each Club will have the number of votes as they were allowed at the October 2008 Convention, three signatures representing the Club will be required to validate the votes. Executive VP Al Rafferty has agreed to be the point person to nudge and prod the Clubs to respond.

I want to thank Ray Crisp, Amy Jones and Linda Parker for all the time and energy they have put to this issue.

If you have questions about any of this please call me or Ray Crisp.

The Blueface is next at the end of February; check out the preregistration and get it taken care of early, please do not wait until the last week to take care of it. Call ahead if nothing else and give the host a heads up on your intentions.

Following the Blueface will be the Wolf Cup, Washington State NASP annual Championship in East Wenatchee.

## NFAA STATE DIRECTOR: Crystal Parker -- NFAA Annual Meeting Report

Every year in conjunction with the Vegas shoot, the 50 state directors meet to discuss Constitution & By-Law changes for the coming year. This year there were over 35 such items submitted. Here are the ones that passed and which will be in effect as of 6/1/09.

- C2: Increase life memberships to six times the annual dues (up from five times)
- C4: Allows the directors and council to function using email, conference calls and other electronic means, without being "in person"
- HQ: Remove NAA from our book in the list of names of archery orgs in the constitution and by-laws since they have changed their name to US Archery
- C6: No alcoholic beverages may be carried or consumed on any archery range or practice area during shooting hours at any NFAA sanctioned or owned tournament. Anyone caught breaking the rule will be immediately disqualified and not allowed to complete the tournament
- C7: Automatically make the surviving spouse in a joint life membership to become the head of household without a charge
- ED1: The NFAA should not let web vendor be a voting member of the committee that oversees web decisions
- CO1: Add Vegas round to official leagues plus associated patches
- MA 1: Allow the NFAA HQ office to accept charter applications if the state does not respond in 30 days. If the state revokes the charter, the NFAA will immediately also revoke the charter
- SE1: This amendment formally removes any doubt about the legality of making decisions at emergency meetings in the future
- NY2&3: Both of these agenda items were lengthy and dealt with coaching certifications. Please take a look at the full item at <https://www.nfaaarchery.org/about/documents.cfm> in the 2009 Agenda Items PDF file.
- GL3: This item was to add the Lake of the Woods and 900 round guidelines to the range captain's guide
- SE5: This item describes what inside out scoring means
- SE9: This item deals with distribution of awards.
- GL2: There will now be a .422" arrow size restriction in all NFAA sanctioned tournaments with a maximum point diameter of .425". This equates to 27/64ths
- NM1: This agenda item legalizes v- bars to bowhunter (it is already in for BHFS and barebow)
- LA1: New speed limit will be 300 fps with a 3% variance and will take effect 6/1/09.

**Redding will still be a 280 fps + 3% variance this year.**

The meetings themselves were very productive and the directors seemed to be motivated to make things work. Every day finished a little earlier than planned and there were very few protracted disagreements.

# HUNTING COMMUNITY NEWS

## WSAA HUNTING VP: Jim Cowgill

Well, where do we begin? Let's start out with what is at stake under the new proposal that is being presented by the WDFW.

- The current proposal:
  - Archery
    - Loses 750 GMU Days
    - Loses only White-tailed buck rut hunt GMU 101
    - Loses all Mule deer buck rut hunts (Entiat)
    - Loses Black-tailed rut hunt
  - Muzzleloader
    - Expand number of GMU's
    - Slight increase of days
    - Mule Deer rut hunting opportunity
    - Added 429 GMU days to general season
  - Modern firearm gets:
    - More elk rut opportunity (by cutting archery deer season)
    - All of the mule deer rut hunting (By turning region 2 into permit only)
    - All of the black-tailed rut hunting
    - All of the white-tailed hunting
    - Add 30 GMU days
- Should modern firearm hunters expect a higher harvest level than muzzleloader hunters?
- Should Muzzleloader hunters expect a higher harvest level than Archery hunters?
- Should Archery hunters always be expected to have the lowest harvest levels?
- Should the WDFW try to allow hunters to be in the maximum number of days without damaging the resource?

I would like to thank Ray and others for laying out the above information and sticking with this. I know that just starting in this position and being throw into this mess without their help I would be from the frying pan into the fire. The things that also need to be mentioned is that we could loose Elk rut days to the modern firearm users and that cougar and bear opportunities could also be affected. If a juggling of those hunt days are moved around it will be tough to take a bear if berries are not in season. I know that we as bow hunters need to make our voices heard and the only way to do that is to be able to have more bow hunters involved. First, in an organization so that they can receive the information, and second to write the department that these changes are unacceptable. The sad truth of the matter is that out of 100 people ranting about it only about three will write and send a letter. It is all about numbers! I sincerely hope to be proven wrong. I would like to point out a few things that we should make mention of in our letters as well as the bullet points above.

# 1 Cost! Changes cost money and in the present state of the economy this would waste resources

# 2 there is no biological reason for the proposed changes and wildlife management is to be conducted with science. It is not to be determined by a popular vote without sound scientific findings or reason

# 3 as bow hunters our harvest percentage is within 5% of our percentage as a user group. That tells me that the present system is working

# 4 we need to demand more areas to hunt for those that we may loose. I would say any three of the following for a late Mule Deer; GMU 136, GMU 284, GMU 149, GMU 163, GMU 181, GMU 186. If some of you have more or better GMU's ask for them. Some of the units that I have listed would probably not support an open hunt but may handle a limited archery only 3-point or better hunt.

I believe that we must really push for more opportunities to hunt, and spread them through out the state. If any of you have thoughts on quality areas or draw only archery hunts please forward them to me.

As I said before "it is all in the numbers!" We need more people within the organization. I would challenge each and every one of us to bring just two new members into the WSAA this year.

Another bill that we may need your letters on is House Bill 1885. It is to prevent the feeding of wild animals. In the draft of the bill, the feeding of animals while hunting legally is exempt, but that can be changed quite easily and the other portions of the bill are far to reaching

We need a large turnout, with some that are willing to speak at the Ellensburg meeting for the final input.

The dates and times March 6-7, 2009, Scheduled for 8:30 AM to 4:30 PM at the Quality Inn, 1700 Canyon Road, Ellensburg.

## MC Championship Memorable Moment

Silver Arrow Bowmen had the opportunity to host the State Indoor Multi-Color Championship again this year, and what a great shoot it turned out to be. The participation was so good we had the need to add a 3PM line to Sunday's schedule. We were hoping to break the triple digit mark for participants but ended up just a little short with 102 registered and 95 actual participants.

As 190 archers passed through our doors over three days, there is one who stands out as the most memorable for the weekend. While collecting score cards from the 1PM line on Sunday Shannon Ostling was one of the last to turn in her card. When she did, I could sense a bit of excitement. I compared the cards and noticed she had shot a 279 and congratulated her on a great score. Shannon explained that this was her best score ever. During the next 20 minutes or so she spent with her family and friends packing up to leave the true level of her excitement really started to show. When you heard her talk you didn't have to look to see that she had smile on her face stretching from ear to ear and she couldn't stand still, she was dancing - bouncing around with pure excitement over her accomplishment. In the words of her mother, she was jazzed up over her score.

Shannon had reason to be excited she not only broke her previous high score of 268 which stood for almost a year, but she set a new "one day" State record breaking the previous score by six points and just missed the two day combined record by one point. As it turns out this is not her first state record. She also holds the Youth Female FSL-R one day and two day State records which she set in 2008. Shannon now competes in the Young Adult Female FSL-R class. She is a 15 year old (16 by the time the article runs) 10<sup>th</sup> grader from Snohomish WA. She started shooting in December 2005 and is shooting under the guidance of Mike Wichser and Larry Anderson with the JOAD program of WCW (Wildlife Committee of Washington) in Bothell.

Congratulations Shannon on a great shoot. I have a feeling we will be seeing your name on a few more state records in the future. Thank you to all of the participants who made this year's shoot such a success.

### WDFW Seeks Public Comments on Proposed 2009-11 Hunting Seasons

OLYMPIA – The Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW) is seeking public input on proposed recommendations for the 2009-11 hunting seasons.

Through Feb. 20, WDFW will accept written comments from the public to help finalize proposed hunting rules and regulations for 2009-11 hunting seasons. The proposals are available for review at <http://wdfw.wa.gov/wlm/game/seasonsetting/>.

The Washington Fish and Wildlife Commission, which sets policy for WDFW, will also take public comment on the proposed recommendations at its March 6-7 meeting in Ellensburg. Final commission action is scheduled to take place at the April 3-4 meeting in Olympia.

The hunting season recommendations, which were developed after extensive public involvement, are also based on the objectives and strategies contained in the new 2009-15 Game Management Plan said Dave Ware, WDFW game manager.

"We appreciate the input we've received over the past months and encourage everyone interested in the 2009-11 hunting seasons to review and comment on the proposed rules before final action is taken," Ware said.

# Crazy Me

I guess I never thought of life being any different. I grew up knowing that I loved the outdoors and wildlife; then I was introduced to hunting. I just didn't know then that I would turn into a hunter, but the more I was exposed to the idea the clearer to me it became.

I wasn't raised in a hunting family and I didn't get the feeling some of my family members approved of my new-found passion. I wouldn't let this deter me. Some say I'm stubborn anyway, but it wasn't about that. I couldn't hold back what I had been looking for and what so many look for in life and that is to be passionate about something. So I hunted.

I started deer hunting in western Washington, good 'ol blacktail country, and my first year I aimed high, I wasn't going to shoot a spike. I ended up shooting a three-point the last weekend of early season and unknowingly started a trend – I was by myself. That was eleven years ago. Since then I have been solo on many hunts and have taken up archery.

Those will be great memories to share with her later.

Even with tough times for everyone, I feel like I'm flying high when it comes to hunting. There is just nothing that can bring me down. We are making our plans for hunting this year and I am getting into shape now for some tough hunts. Gotta believe this is my year. One never knows, but the anticipation is thrilling. Call me crazy, I love it.

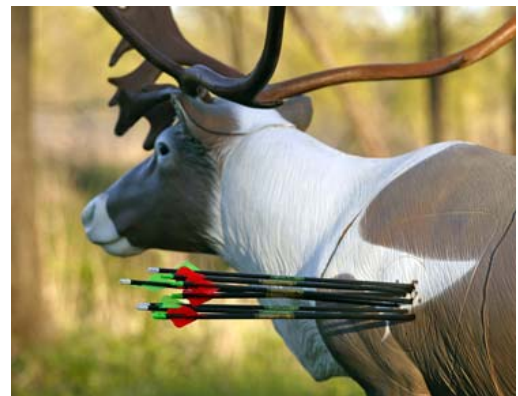
