## 2009 Washington NASP Championship

Over 200 archers representing 15 schools from around Washington State converged at East Wenatchee on 21 March 2009 to compete in the Washington NASP State Championship. Eastmont Junior High School Gymnasium was the venue for this event. Students vied for individual awards for both boys and girls as well as for school team trophies in competition categories of Elementary School, Middle School, and High School. High scoring teams and individuals received trophies and awards, and also qualified to participate in the National Championship to be held May 8-9 in Louisville Kentucky.

These students have been participating in the National Archery in the Schools Program "Archery - On Target for Life". Archers use standardized bows and arrows to shoot at bulls-eye targets at distances of 10 meters and 15 meters. Each archer shoots 15 arrows at each distance, with value of 10 points for a center hit descending to 1 point for a rim shot. Maximum score is 300 points for the round.

The School Team Competition combines the individual scores of each school's top four girls, top four boys, and next four overall, totaling those twelve scores for the team score. The Wolf Cup – awarded to the high scoring team – was won by the team from Easton High School.

High scoring male and female archers received a special edition chrome-finished Genesis bow and a Morrell target donated by the manufacturers. High Male was Jake Webster, of Easton High School. High scoring female was Megan Aliverti, a fifth-grade student at Heights Elementary of Clarkston. 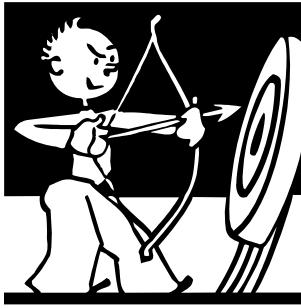

## THE WOLF CUP SETS MORE RECORDS

What a weekend! Friday we set up 30 targets with all the accompanying bow racks, floor quivers, target numbers, tape for shooting lanes and banners in two gymnasiums. Then made sure the computer was ready to go and a million little things were in place. All of this taking place after school let out at Eastmont Jr High in East Wenatchee.

Saturday started early with the final setup scheduled for 7:00 AM. However instead of setting up right away, we actually experienced our first real scare of the day as we found the awards, goodie bags, and t-shirts were locked in a room that our key couldn't unlock. The Principal from Clovis Point saved the day and we were ready to meet the first archery teams as they arrived around 8:00 AM.

We had 210 students shoot during the course of the day, with nearly a 100 students shooting on the 3:00 PM line. The grandstands were packed all day and were still full as we started the award ceremony after a very long and exciting day.

Let's talk about a Dynasty! Easton Schools, which is small by any standard with a K-12 student population of less than a hundred kids, has taken first place for the High School Team and has taken the overall tournament team high score for the third straight year. They missed the team high score at the first annual Wolf Cup because they were unable to field a complete team, but guess what! That year the Easton Middle School team took top honors. Can anyone put together a team that can knock them off? They own the Wolf Cup so far and I don't think they're going to and let it go easily.

The Wolf Cup produced another simply amazing story! Thanks to the support of Pat Ogden and the Clarkston School District, four Clarkston Elementary schools joined Lincoln Middle School in offering archery to their students. One of those schools was able to get themselves ready, came to the Wolf Cup and, BOY, did they get noticed! The Heights Hawks set a new Wolf Cup Elementary School record of 2541, besting the previous record, set by Deer Park, by 284 points. Now for the amazing story....the Hawks were lead by the TOURNAMENT high scoring girl, Megan Aliverti. Megan is in the 5<sup>th</sup> grade. She shot a 264 out of a possible 300. And not only did she score higher than all of the older girls, she also shoot a higher score than all but 1 middle and 3 high school boys. Congratulations Megan.

How amazing is it that we have a sport were the field of play is so level that personal skill can allow you to compete head to head across gender and age with a realistic possibility of winning. We had a 5<sup>th</sup> grader win her division, win the overall high score for her gender and tie for 5<sup>th</sup> place overall out of 210 shooters.

We had a tremendous amount of help from the Wenatchee Sportsmen's Association at the Wolf Cup. These guys and gals helped with the setup, scoring, take down and anything else we needed. THANK YOU VERY MUCH!! If you live in the Wenatchee area and don't belong to this group you are making a big mistake.

## USSAF and NWTF Join Forces to Promote Outdoor Appreciation

### Signature Outdoor Education Programs to Collaborate

(Columbus) - The U S Sportsmen's Alliance Foundation (USSAF) and the National Wild Turkey Federation (NWTF) are joining forces to bring the excitement of outdoor sports to America's youth.

The two partner organizations will collaborate by bringing together their signature outdoor education programs, the JAKES program and the Trailblazer Adventure Program, to offer more opportunities for American children and their families to enjoy outdoor sports than ever before.

The NWTF's JAKES program, or Juniors Acquiring Knowledge, Ethics, and Sportsmanship offer youth 17 and under a chance to learn about the outdoors. The JAKES program has regional and local events designed to teach kids the skills necessary to be successful and safe in the outdoors.

Last year, over 800 JAKES events were held across the country.

"At many 2009 Trailblazer Adventure Day sites, the NWTF JAKES program will be a featured station, with attendees having the ability to register for an upcoming JAKES program on the spot," said George Thornton, NWTF CEO. "This partnership will afford youth and their families more opportunities to learn more about conservation and outdoor sports while at the same time highlighting both organizations successful youth programs."

## State's New 3-Year Hunting Plan Includes Non-Toxic Shot Rules, Muzzleloader Hunts



OLYMPIA – The Washington Fish and Wildlife Commission adopted statewide hunting seasons and regulations that include restrictions on toxic shot and more hunting opportunities for muzzleloaders over the next three years.

The new seasons, approved during a public meeting here April 3-4, establish hunting rules for deer, elk, moose, bighorn sheep, mountain goat, black bear, cougar and small game in 2009-11.

The commission, which sets policy for the Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW), adopted the new three-year hunting plan after nearly eight months of public comment and review. As part of that process, WDFW wildlife managers conducted public meetings around the state and contacted more than 50,000 licensed hunters by e-mail to solicit their ideas on various management options under consideration.

“Within the framework of state conservation goals, we try to accommodate the public as much as we can in designing state hunting seasons,” said Dave Brittell, assistant director of the WDFW wildlife program. “These seasons reflect the ideas of thousands of Washingtonians, both hunters and non-hunters alike.”

Under one new policy approved by the commission, WDFW will phase in an expansion of state restrictions on the use of lead shot, which are toxic to birds and other wildlife that ingest it. Noting that toxic shot has been banned in hunting waterfowl since 1991, Brittell said WDFW has been expanding that prohibition to other hunts around the state.

New this year, hunters will be required to use non-toxic shot when hunting upland game birds or mourning doves in three units of the Sunnyside-Snake River Wildlife Area, where ingestion of lead shot by wildlife is of particular concern. In 2011, the non-toxic shot requirement will be expanded to all established WDFW pheasant-release sites.

The commission also approved a number of other changes in hunting rules and seasons in the following areas:

- **Deer and elk seasons:** Starting this year, hunting opportunities for muzzleloaders will be expanded in several ways and special-permit hunts with modern firearms will be added when mature bucks and bulls are most available. Hunting seasons for archers, who currently have the longest seasons of any user group, were modified to accommodate these changes.
- **Cougar hunting:** The commission approved a statewide archery-only season Sept. 1-25 and a muzzleloader-only season Sept. 26-Oct. 16 to make hunting options for cougar consistent with deer and elk seasons during those periods.
- **Bear seasons:** Most seasons will remain the same for 2009, but regulations for 2010-11 were deferred pending further study of bear populations that show signs of decline in some areas of the state. Management units that formerly opened the day after Labor Day will open Sept. 1, consistent with the opening day of archery season.
- **Hunting equipment:** Hunters using muzzleloaders or archery equipment will be allowed to carry a handgun for personal protection if they have a concealed pistol permit. Hunters may also use black powder pistols to hunt during muzzleloader seasons.

A description of these and other initiatives in the three-year hunting plan approved by the commission is posted on the Hunting page of the WDFW website at <http://wdfw.wa.gov/hunting/>. The new hunting rules and seasons will also be incorporated into the 2009 Big Game Hunting pamphlet, which is now available.

## WCW ARCHERY

### 2009 Outdoor Season

It doesn't seem like it's spring, but WCW archers are hosting the first in a series of outdoor target tournaments the weekend of April 25 and 26, 2009.

Here are the basics:

- Saturday: A 144-arrow FITA qualifying round.
- Sunday: Pick either a 70m round followed by an Olympic Round shoot off **or** a kid- or novice-friendly 900-round in meters.
- **On both days practice ends will be shot from 9 – 9:45 am. First arrow for score: 10 am.**
- We will have a one-hour break.
- No club or national memberships are required, we follow NAA rules.
- Wear your mud shoes, the range is still sloppy.
- Target fees for adults are Saturday: \$12, Sunday: \$10, Both days: \$20. Youths are less depending on age.

A FITA match consists of 144 arrows shot at four distances. Men shoot 90m, 70m, 50m and 30m. Women shoot 70m, 60m, 50m and 30m. Younger archers shoot shorter kid-friendly distances. [A good chart is available at Texas Archery.](#) The peak draw weight for compound bows cannot exceed 60 pounds. A 70m round consists of 72 arrows at Olympic distances. The standard 900-round is 90 arrows at 60-50-40 meters. Shorter distances for kids.

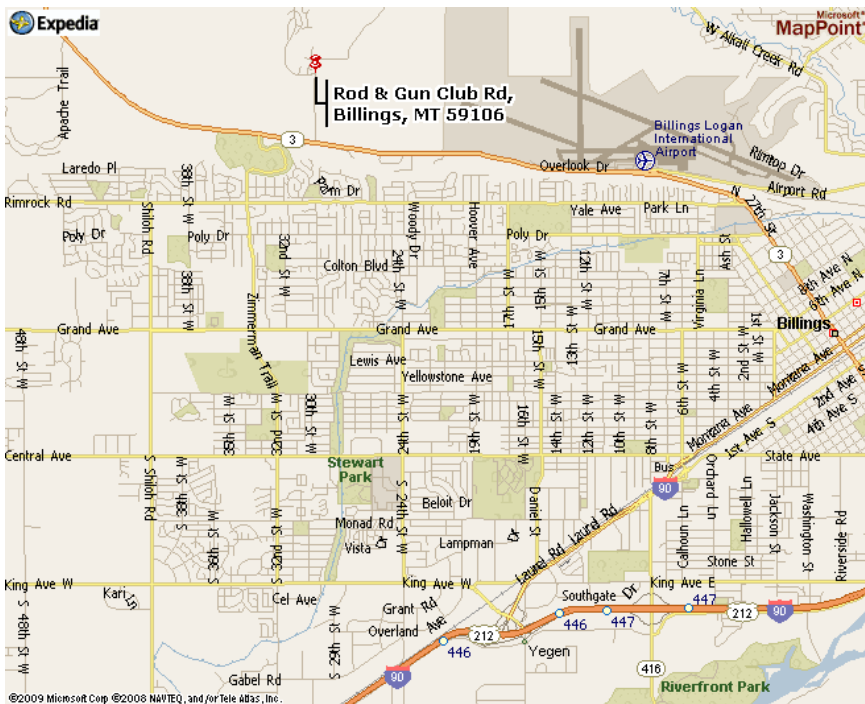

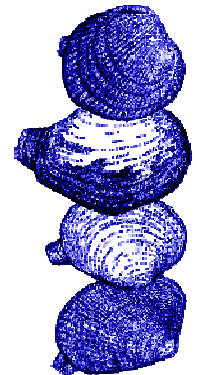

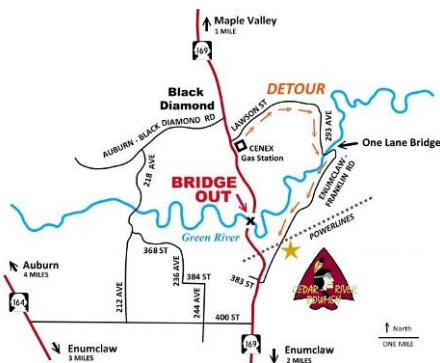
