## Northwest Archers at NFAA Outdoor National Championship

Seven Washington archers and four from Oregon represented the Northwest at the 2009 NFAA Outdoor National Championship. From Washington came Linda and TC Parker, Liane and Gerald Hickman, Chuck and Trevor Moles and Matt Schmitz. Oregon archers were Mark Eaves, Vince Herschell, Greg Poole, and Bob Cunningham. No archers were listed from Idaho, Montana, or Wyoming. Total attendance was a very good showing at 517.

The NW Archers brought home two Championship silver bowls (MS-F-FS Liane Hickman and S-F-FSL Linda Parker) three Second Place medals (A-M-FS Mark Eaves, S-M-FSL Vince Herschell, and S-M-Trad Gerald Hickman) and two Third Place medals (A-M-BHFS Matt Schmitz and S-M-FSL Bob Cunningham).

This year's event was held in Mechanicsburg Pennsylvania, during 22-26 July. Site of the event was the Mechanicsburg Sportsmen Club, with five gently rolling, grassy courses under hardwood forests. Each of the courses (Red, White, Blue, Yellow, and the new Black course) was well marked and closely mowed, with almost every position wide enough for all three or four archers in the group to shoot side-by-side. This procedure kept up a very fast pace, and we were done shooting at about 2:00 PM each day. Weather was hot, hazy, and humid, with overcast skies and little to no wind. The humidity built until releasing in thunderstorms that rolled in after the shooters were off the course, but the final day (Sunday) started out with a little rain.

The Mechanicsburg location was a little different from all the other National Outdoor tournaments I have attended, with a more urban environment offering several hotels and restaurants. We flew into Harrisburg airport and picked up a rental car. It was only a short drive to the suggested lodging at the Holiday Inn, which offered an onsite restaurant, bar, TWO swimming pools (one indoor and one outdoor) a miniature golf course, "beach" volleyball courts, a softball field, and picnic area. What a great place to settle in for a week! Our hotel reservation included free breakfast. Diner options included the hotel restaurant, Outback Steakhouse, Olive Garden, TGI Friday's, and many others. During the tournament, the hosts also served breakfast at the range, and sandwiches, snacks and beverages were available on the courses.

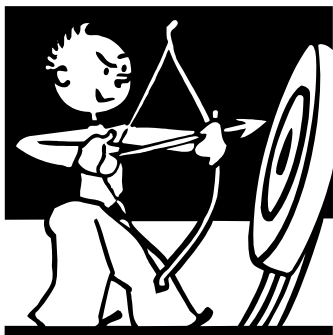
If Mechanicsburg bids and wins as host for the 2012 NFAA Outdoor National, we'll be there!

### Help make the NFAA YOUR organization

It is September again and that means it is time to submit agenda items to the NFAA annual meeting. For you new NFAA members, you should know that every year the NFAA holds a gathering of the state directors before the Vegas shoot, where the directors get an update on the health of the NFAA and we review and approve proposed changes (collectively known as "Agenda Items") to the constitution and by-laws. The agenda items come from you, the members, and are one way that the membership sets the direction for the NFAA. There is nothing magical about an agenda item. It can be as simple as a change to the wording of a rule to make it clearer, or as complicated as a complete re-write of a rule. They can also be submitted to add or remove rules.

This year the formal deadline for submitting agenda items is 9/30/09. While the end of September seems early for this process to be finished, it is necessary to give the state directors the time to get input on the agenda items from all states so that we can vote our member's wishes. In Washington we do that at the state convention and via emails once the full list of agenda items is made public.

If you would like to submit an agenda item, you can do so by sending me the following information in email or US Mail:

If it is to remove an existing rule, provide the page, article, section, paragraph and item with the notation to remove.

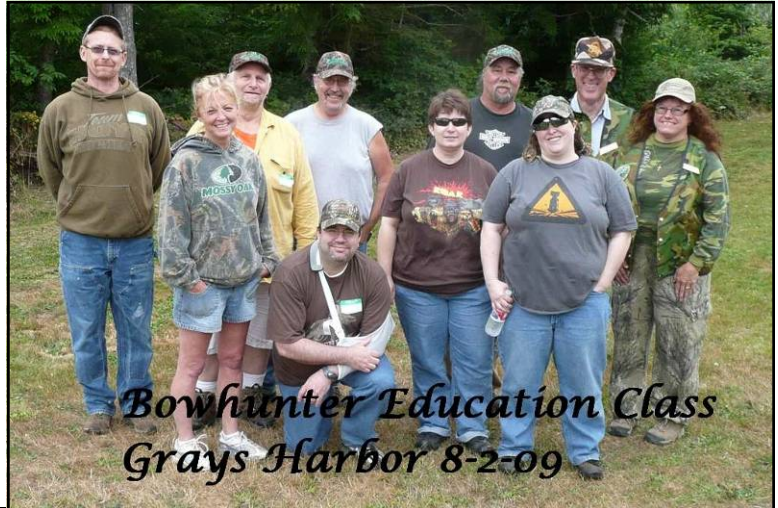
Hopefully every one got a chance to get out and hunt the deer season. Please remember don't pack your elk tubes with you or you might get a ticket for hunting elk out of season.

## Safety Is the Watchword As Hunting Season Nears

OLYMPIA – With the black bear hunting season opening throughout most of the state Aug. 1, the Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW) reminds hunters and others recreating outdoors to be safety conscious.

“A variety of people, including hunters, hikers, anglers and campers, share the outdoors in Washington,” said Bruce Bjork, chief of WDFW enforcement. “We all must do our part to stay safe, as well as ensure the safety of others.”

While fatal hunting incidents involving non-hunters are rare, last August in Skagit County a hiker was shot and killed by a hunter who mistook her for a bear. That incident was the state's first hunting-related fatality involving a non-hunter in at least a quarter-century.

A basic rule for hunters is to “know your target and what's beyond it” before shooting, said Bjork. That's one of several important safety rules taught during state hunter-education courses, required for all first-time hunters born after Jan. 1, 1972.

Others spending time outdoors are also advised to take precautions. WDFW offers the following safety tips to anyone recreating outdoors during hunting seasons:

- **Wear brightly colored clothing:** Make yourself visible by wearing bright colors, such as blaze orange. Avoid wearing earth-tones.
- **Make noise:** Alert hunters to your presence by talking, singing or whistling. If you hear someone shooting, let the hunters know you are in the area by raising your voice.
- **Remain alert and never assume you are alone:** Hikers, hunters, forest-product workers and anglers may be present in remote areas.
- **Be aware of hunting seasons:** Hunting seasons occur in Washington throughout the year, except June and July. More information on hunting seasons is available on WDFW's website at <http://wdfw.wa.gov/wlm/game/hunter/hunter.htm>.

The black bear season, which often draws thousands of hunters, is the first of several hunting seasons scheduled to open in the coming weeks. Several other hunts get under way in September, including those for forest grouse and waterfowl, as well as archery seasons for cougar, deer and elk. Popular modern-firearm hunts for deer and elk open later in the fall.

More than 200,000 hunters go afield each year in Washington. Hunting is lawful on most public lands except national and state parks, and on private land with land-owner permission.

## Volunteers Needed To Facilitate Access for Special-Permit Hunts near Mount St. Helens

OLYMPIA – The Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW) is seeking volunteers to participate in a cooperative arrangement that has given hunters access to approximately 250,000 acres of private timberlands near Mount St. Helens in the last two years.

For the third year, Weyerhaeuser Company is prepared to give hunters holding special elk permits additional motorized access to miles of private logging roads on the St. Helens Tree Farm – provided that enough volunteers can be found to assure a safe and orderly hunt.

Key tasks for volunteers include orienting hunters, staffing access points and maintaining safety buffers between hunters and active Weyerhaeuser operations, said Sandra Jonker, regional wildlife manager for WDFW. The program attracted 54 volunteers in 2007 and 61 volunteers last year, Jonker said.

“We hope the number of committed volunteers continues to rise every year as more people hear about the program,” she said. “As before, the amount of timberland that will be opened to hunting will be in direct proportion to the number of volunteers that sign up.”

Participants will be required to attend one of six orientation sessions, scheduled to begin at 6 p.m. on the dates and at the locations noted below:

- September 2, September 30, November 4 and November 18 at the Cowlitz PUD, 961 12th Ave., Longview.
- September 23 at the Olympia Natural Resource Building, Room 172, 1111 Washington St. S.E., Olympia:
- October 1 at the Vancouver Regional Office, 2108 Grand Blvd., Vancouver, WA.

Volunteer organizations, led by the Southwest Washington Land Access Coalition, have secured funding to reimburse volunteers for mileage accrued as participants in the program.

Other partners in the program include Eyes in the Woods, Cowlitz Game & Anglers, Washington State Archery Association, Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation, Yacolt Burn Sportsmen Club, Vancouver Wildlife League and the Washington State Bowhunters.

The partnership between WDFW, Weyerhaeuser and the volunteer organizations is designed to expand hunter access to portions of the St. Helens Tree Farm that lie within game management units (GMUs) 520 (Winston), 524 (Margaret), 550 (Coweeman) and 556 (Toutle). Jonker said the access program – combined with the issuance of additional special hunting permits – has helped to increase harvest levels over the past two years throughout the Mount St. Helens elk herd. That is a key goal under the department’s management plan for the herd, the largest of ten elk herds in the state.

“The department’s management plan calls for reducing the herd’s size to about 10,000 animals over five years to bring the number of animals into balance with available habitat,” Jonker said. “We want to thank Weyerhaeuser and all the volunteers participating in the St. Helens Land Access Program for their help in this joint effort.”

# CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS COMMITTEE

## RESOLUTION 1009-1

Submitted by NASP Committee, 01 August 2009

**WHEREAS;** WSAA Constitution, ARTICLE III: MEMBERSHIP contains no provisions for schools and other organizations participating in the National Archery in the Schools or the After School Archery Program.

**WHEREAS;** It is a goal of Washington State Archery Association to promote and support these programs.

**WHEREAS;** WSAA Tournament Rules and Procedures require WSAA Membership for participation in our Championship Tournaments; but individual Adult and Independent Junior memberships for all potential participants in this program is cost-prohibitive to those schools and clubs

**BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED:** That the **WSAA Constitution ARTICLE III: MEMBERSHIP** **WSAA By-Laws ARTICLE III: Fees and Dues, and WSAA Standing Rules Article I: Membership**, be modified to add a new paragraphs and revise other paragraphs as follows. Section will read:

### WASHINGTON STATE ARCHERY ASSOCIATION CONSTITUTION

#### ARTICLE III: MEMBERSHIP

Membership shall be granted to anyone, regardless of race, creed, color, sex or national origin, who meets the below requirements:

Classes of membership shall include Complimentary, Honorary Life, Paid Life, Spouse Life, Adult (head of household), Spouse, Junior, Independent Junior, Club, Commercial, NASP School, ASAP Club, NASP / ASAP Leader, and NASP / ASAP Participant.

[Paragraphs 1-12 remain as is, not repeated here]

13. NASP School Membership shall be granted to any Washington School participating in the National Archery in the Schools Program, upon application and payment of annual fees and dues, submission of a copy of their NASP Agreement, and upon approval by the Washington State NASP Coordinator.
14. ASAP Club Membership shall be granted to any Washington ASAP Club participating in the After School Archery Program, upon application and payment of annual fees and dues, submission of a copy of their ASAP Application, and upon approval by the Washington State NASP Coordinator.
15. NASP / ASAP Leader Membership shall be granted to anyone who has attained his or her eighteenth (18<sup>th</sup>) birthday and attained certification as a Basic Archery Instructor (BAI) or NAA /NFAA Certified Archery Instructor, upon application and payment of regular fees and dues.
16. NASP / ASAP Participant Membership for individuals under eighteen (18) years of age OR a full-time student may be added to their NASP / ASAP Leader membership upon payment of applicable fees and dues.  
[renumber original paragraph 13 as 17]
17. Fees and dues under this article shall imply membership fees and dues.

### WASHINGTON STATE ARCHERY ASSOCIATION BY-LAWS

#### ARTICLE III: FEES AND DUES

1. Fees and dues shall be proposed by the Board of Directors and sanctioned by the governing body.  
Dues for membership shall be as follows:  
Individual Adult (Head of Family) \$30.00/Year  
Spouse \$10.00/Year  
Each Additional Junior Family Member [Under 18] \$2.00/year  
(There will be no charge for additional Junior Family Members in excess of two)  
Individual Junior Member [Under 18] \$10.00/Year  
Life Membership [Payable 25%/Quarter] \$300.00  
Spousal Life Membership [31% of Life] \$93.00  
**Initial** Club Membership (Charter) \$20.00  
Club Membership (Charter) \$15.00  
**Initial** Commercial Membership (Charter) \$20.00  
Commercial Membership (Charter) \$15.00  
(No Club Charter shall be issued or renewed in the name of a commercial archery establishment.)

NASP School Membership (Charter) \$15.00  
 ASAP Club Membership (Charter) \$15.00  
 NASP / ASAP Leader Membership (Adult) \$15.00/Year  
 Each additional NASP / ASAP Participant Membership (Under 18 OR Student) \$2.00/year

2. Two (2) dollars of each annual Individual Adult membership dues and two dollars of each spouse membership dues shall be deposited into the Bowhunter and Sportsmen's Defense Fund.

## **STANDING RULES OF THE WASHINGTON STATE ARCHERY ASSOCIATION**

### **ARTICLE I: MEMBERSHIP**

1. Upon payment of initial dues each member may be provided with:
  - A. Membership card
  - B. Tournament Calendar
  - C. Archery/Bowhunting annual (if / when an edition is produced)
  - D. Subscription to the official publication "Quiver"
 

Note: Items A through D apply to Life, Adult and NASP / ASAP Leader memberships.  
 Items A through D apply to Independent Junior membership.  
 Item A applies to Complimentary, Spouse, Junior and NASP / ASAP Participant memberships.
  - E. Eight dollars (\$8.00) of each of these memberships eligible to receive the Quiver (item D above) shall be set aside and earmarked to cover the costs of providing this publication to them.
 

Note: Patches and decals are to remain a "sale" item.

## **RESOLUTION 1009-2**

Submitted by Crystal Parker, NFAA Director. Submitted at Board Meeting July 11, 2009.

**WHEREAS;** the WSAA Standing Rules address the selection of a NFAA Director

**WHEREAS;** these positions are currently filled by appointment by the President with approval by the Board

**WHEREAS;** the Standing Rules do not set requirements for candidates for these positions.

**WHEREAS;** the Standing Rules do not set duties or responsibilities for these positions.

**BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED:** That the Standing rules Article XVI: NATIONAL FIELD ARCHERY ASSOCIATION be modified to specify procedures for election of the NFAA Director, outline duties of the NFAA Director, and to require that the NFAA Director be a member of WSAA and of NFAA.

If approved, modify **Standing Rules Article XVI: NATIONAL FIELD ARCHERY ASSOCIATION** to read:

### **ARTICLE XVI: NATIONAL FIELD ARCHERY ASSOCIATION**

1. The NF AA Director shall be elected by a vote of the active NFAA Members who claim the state of Washington as their NFAA affiliated state.
  - Election will be by a simple majority of votes cast by the end of the annual convention.
  - Votes may be cast in person, via US Postal Mail, or via internet provided that the status and identity of the active NFAA member can be verified.
  - A ballot listing the slate of candidates will be published in the October issue of The Quiver and will be posted on the WSAA Website.
2. Nominations may be made by any WSAA/NFAA adult member in good standing. All nominations must be accompanied by a letter of acceptance and statement of qualifications. Nominations for consideration must be received by the recording secretary no later than August 1<sup>st</sup> in order for the final list of candidates to be included in the September Quiver
3. The term of the NFAA director will be of 2 years, starting on April 1 in even years and leaving office on March 31.
4. The NFAA Director must be a member at all times of WSAA and of NFAA.
5. The NFAA Director will advise and assist the Tournament Committee in administering NFAA Sanctioned WSAA Championship tournaments, solicit matters which should be Agenda Items for the NFAA meeting, brief the membership on the Agenda Items proposed by other states and determine the stance the WSAA desires. Establish a list of approved Range Inspectors, and designate who will perform those inspections that the Director doesn't do personally.

## RESOLUTION 1009-3

Submitted by Constitution and By-Laws Committee, 01 August 2009.

**WHEREAS;** the WSAA Standing Rules address the selection of a NAA Director

**WHEREAS;** these positions are currently filled by appointment by the President with approval by the Board

**WHEREAS;** the Standing Rules do not set requirements for candidates for these positions.

**WHEREAS;** the Standing Rules do not set duties or responsibilities for these positions.

**BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED:** That the Standing rules Article XV: NATIONAL ARCHERY ASSOCIATION be modified to specify procedures for election of the NAA Director, outline duties of the NAA Director, and to require that the NAA Director be a member of WSAA and of NAA.

If approved, modify **Standing Rules Article XV: NATIONAL ARCHERY ASSOCIATION** to read:

### ARTICLE XV: NATIONAL ARCHERY ASSOCIATION

1. The NAA Coordinator / Director shall be elected by a vote of the active NAA Members who reside in the state of Washington.
  - Election will be by a simple majority of votes cast by the end of the annual convention.
  - Votes may be cast in person, via US Postal Mail, or via internet provided that the status and identity of the active NAA member can be verified.
  - A ballot listing the slate of candidates will be published in the October issue of The Quiver and will be posted on the WSAA Website.
2. Nominations may be made by any Washington NAA adult member in good standing. All nominations must be accompanied by a letter of acceptance and statement of qualifications. Nominations for consideration must be received by the recording secretary no later than August 1<sup>st</sup> in order for the final list of candidates to be included in the September Quiver
3. The term of the NAA director will be of 2 years, starting on April 1 in odd years and leaving office on March 31.
4. The NAA Director must be a member at all times of WSAA and of NAA.
5. The NAA Director will advise and assist the Tournament Committee in administering NAA Sanctioned WSAA Championship tournaments, solicit matters which should be Agenda Items for the NAA meeting, brief the membership on the Agenda items proposed by other states and determine the stance the WSAA desires. Inform and advise the members and chartered clubs / shops on the availability of NAA Junior programs.
6. Expenses may be allowed as in Article II of the Standing Rules.
7. The NAA Director is NOT a voting member of the Board of Directors.

## NASP COORDINATOR: Dave Mack

WSAA has been approved for another large grant from the Washington Department of Fish & Wildlife to help new schools acquire the equipment need to start a daytime archery program for their kids. A similar grant helped us start 11 new schools last year. This year we are aiming at an additional 20 schools which will bring our State wide total to 65 schools. This means that between 15,000 and 20,000 kids will experience archery during their PE class next year in Washington State. Unlike our Shows Events where a couple of volunteers share archery with 20 – 200 kids one time, NASP is training teachers around the state about archery, teaching them how to present it to their students, helping them get the needed equipment and helping them develop a sphere of other archery opportunities where the students can use their new-found skills. Once established, these teachers will present the program over and over for years with an average of 300 students per year. And they get paid to do it.

This past year has been packed with obligations that have made it difficult for me to keep up with everything. My leadership of NASP this past year has been very poor and for that I apologize. I have asked for and received offers of help from many of you but the truth is that I've been so buried away from NASP and with the daily NASP activities that I have not been able to keep any rhythm of progress going with NASP at all. Our leadership team needs to grow and take on more of the specialized areas of the program. We need help with After School Archery programs, teacher training, advanced archery instructor training, promotion of NASP to new schools, follow up and maintenance of existing NASP programs, development of intramural and extracurricular archery competition for the kids and leadership guidance for growth and sustainability of the NASP and ASAP program in Washington.

This is a pivotal year for our program. We have a bunch going for use with the grant and the Foundation status for WSAA. I will try harder to pare down my other obligations. My second retirement is getting near but it may still be a year out with the design projects I've got on the shelf. Let me know if you are interested in helping with leadership responsibilities. My goal is to set a planning meeting for October.

Let's get this training rolling again.
