## SILVER ARROW BOWMEN: NW Outdoor Sectional

Silver Arrow Bowmen were pleased to be asked to host the NFAA NW Sectional Field Tournament on 19-20 June 2010. There were 53 registered archers in attendance, coming from both Washington and Idaho. There were a wide variety of styles and ages as evidenced by the 20 different first place awards given out at the end of the Competition.



Archers arrived to near perfect shooting weather, high overcast that was not too hot or too cold. The first day was really long as the archers shot 28 Field Targets in a just over six hours. They then came in for a break. After the targets were changed, they went out for another two hours shooting the 14 targets of the Animal Round. The Animal Targets were set on our back 14 because that terrain doesn't contain as much uphill and downhill as the front 14.

After completing the course and turning in their scorecards, most competitors left for the evening but there were several that took advantage of our ability to again offer camping at the range and had brought campers or trailers and stayed. We believe, having camping available again, will be a real asset to our course. The winery next door had a country band playing for several hours Saturday evening so anyone staying had music to listen to.

Sunday morning brought the threat of rain but we were fortunate that only a few sprinkles were felt before everyone finished their 28 targets of the Hunter Round. Scores were again turned in and tallied as a Silent Auction was being held for three Gift Baskets. A Coffee Basket donated by the Starkweathers, a Cheese Basket, donated by Golden Glen Creamery and the Culvers and a Wine Basket donated by Challenger Creek Winery. The proceeds of the auction were split between NASP and our Silver Arrow Bowmen 4-H Group.

Thank you to Tim Davis, WSAA Tournament VP, as he was kind enough to present the awards for us. There were several WSAA Field records were broken during the weekend. Nice going guys and girls. All the scores for the tournament are posted on the WSAA Forum under Tournament Scores, NFAA NW Sectional Field Scores. Results were also reported in the July 2010 Quiver.

Silver Arrow Officers did have a bit of a scare when the local Fire Department with sirens screaming came up the hill toward our dead end road. Fortunately for us, at the last minute they turned down another road. Whew. All in all, it was an honor to be asked to hold the competition and we were glad to do it.

## **WCW to Resurrect the PNAA Championship**

On the weekend of August 21 and 22, the archers of the Wildlife Committee of Washington (WCW) will host a resurrection of the Pacific Northwest Archery Association Championship at the Kenmore archery range.

The PNAA, the oldest archery organization in the region dating back to the 1920s, for many years was the premier archery tournament in the Washington, Oregon and British Columbia. Membership in the organization consists of archers who show up and shoot the tournament. Your entry fee is your annual dues. Under the traditional PNAA format, on Saturday we will shoot a Canadian 1200 Round consisting of 120 arrows total at four distances, 70m, 60m, 50m and 40m, at a large target. On Sunday we will shoot a PNAA Round, 90 arrows at 70m, 60m and 50m. Shorter distances will be available for younger archers.

The range will be open for practice at 9 am and the first arrows for score will be shot at 10 am.

While we will be using modern equipment, we will follow the customary PNAA bow classifications: compound, recurve and bare bow. If it has cams and cables, a bow is classified as a compound. If it has a stabilizer and a fancy sight, it's a recurve. If you bow is something your grandfather would have shot at the PNAA, you have a bare bow. No, we won't require anyone to shoot wood or Fiberglas arrows!

The time-honored custom of the PNAA is that winners of the event are awarded for one year the possession of an antique box holding arrows from previous winners. Winners then add an arrow of their own to the collection. Since it has been some time since a PNAA has been held, we are hoping previous winners or their relatives will be able to provide the old traveling trophy boxes. ## Archery World Cup Makes First U.S. Appearance

For the first time ever, the United States will host one of the qualifying stages of the 2010 Archery World Cup season in Ogden, Utah. The four-day event, set for August 3-7, will feature some of the best elite-level archers from across the world. Archers will be earning valuable points at Ogden's third of four stages in hopes of qualifying for the 2010 World Cup Final in Edinburgh, Great Britain in September.

The pivotal third stage will be held at Weber State University with the finals contested at picturesque Lindquist Field. Ogden will also play host for the 2011 and 2012 Archery World Cups. The 2010 World Cup season started in Porec, Croatia, and was followed by the second leg in Antalya, Turkey. The fourth qualifying event will be in Shanghai, China.

The Archery World Cup, which started in 2006, has been a popular event for athletes, sponsors, media and fans. The FITA-sanctioned event allows organizers to select unique competition venues, which included hosting the finals by shooting over a canal at the 2009 Archery World Cup in Denmark, and competing from a floating platform at the 2006 final in Dubai.

### 35 Countries Registered

The Archery World Cup has grown into one of the annual premiere events for the international federation that attracts approximately 300 athletes from 30 countries at each of the various qualifying stages. As of June 18, the preliminary list of attending countries stands at 35.

"We are extremely excited about the positive response to date from our international counterparts," said Greg Easton, President of the Ogden World Cup Organizing Committee. "I attribute some of our attraction to the overall success of the Youth World Championships, which was held in Ogden last summer and brought 50 countries with almost 600 athletes."

### Team USA Dominating After Two World Cup Stages

The 2010 Archery World Cup season to date can best be described as energizing, exhilarating and thrilling for Team USA. After the first two stages, the Americans have collected an astonishing 14 medals to lead the World Cup Nations Ranking with 443 points. The next closest is Russia with 234, while China anchors third with 191.

2008 U.S. Olympian Brady Ellison has been the inspiring recurve leader as he has collected five medals, winning gold in recurve men and recurve mixed team at the Croatia World Cup. In Turkey's second leg, Ellison brought home the silver in recurve men's team and recurve mixed team, while rebounding for a bronze in recurve men. Ellison has dedicated the 2010 archery season to help raise awareness and monies for *Brady's Shoot for the Cure to X-Out Breast Cancer*.

On the compound side, Erika Anschutz has earned one medal of each color. She claimed her first individual World Cup title in Turkey for the second stage. Anschutz helped the women's team to the silver in Croatia and claimed a bronze in the Turkey compound mixed team event.

"We are really proud of the United States' performances in the first two stages," said Denise Parker, USA Archery, CEO. "We look forward to competing on our home soil in Ogden this summer."

## BOWHUNTER EDUCATION: Annette Crews

Wildlife populations in urban areas are always a difficult problem to handle. Many people who moved there because of the beautiful hills and trees don't like the deer eating the roses but don't think we should hunt them. As the housing development continues to encroach on the wildlife populations, we need to help the WDFW come up with a plan that won't cost the state money but will bring in revenue to the state. Yes, I'm talking about a plan to carefully hunt over-crowded areas receiving complaints of property damage. The Wildlife manager's job is to maintain the number of animals in a habitat at or below the habitat's carrying capacity. Kind of like a rancher that has "this much land" that will feed just so many animals. Wildlife managers take into consideration habitat conditions, breeding populations, human growth planning approved by the county, and historic trends.

Our wildlife Managers know that with a variety of practices they can keep the habitat in balance. An important part of the picture includes the public and their knowledge of the wild game they come in contact with and / or harvest. We need to attend meetings and help guide the people who make the decisions for the future of bowhunting. A Bowhunter Education class is good training for hunters who will have access to these sensitive areas populated by many non-hunters.

## Protect Wildlife Lands by Following Fire Cautions

As outdoor enthusiasts head out this Fourth of July weekend, Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW) land managers remind them to be careful with fire on wildlife lands.

"Our cold, wet spring may have some thinking that fire danger is low," said WDFW lands manager Paul Dahmer, "but those conditions actually made for extraordinarily lush vegetation that is now drying out and becoming fuel for wildfire."

Restrictions on campfires and prohibitions on fireworks are in place on 900,000 acres of wildlife areas and water-access sites managed by WDFW. Where campfires are allowed, they usually must be contained in metal fire rings and kept to less than three feet in height and diameter. Specific rules by location can be found at [http://wdfw.wa.gov/lands/wildlife\\_areas/public\\_conduct.html](http://wdfw.wa.gov/lands/wildlife_areas/public_conduct.html).

People cause 85 percent of Washington's wildfires, according to wildfire experts at the state Department of Natural Resources (DNR). Obeying fire restrictions and using caution and common sense are the most important steps people can take to preserve public recreation lands and wildlife habitat.

Anyone recreating outdoors should follow DNR's campfire safety tips:

- Never start a campfire when wind is strong or local fire danger is high
- Use a screen over and around a campfire to minimize sparks
- Keep fires under three feet high and wide
- Keep five gallons of water and a shovel nearby
- Never leave fires unattended
- Extinguish a fire by drowning it thoroughly with water, stirring until cold, and then drowning it again

Class participants become a Certified Witness for the Washington State Department Of Fish & Wildlife (WDFW).

## Women's Workshop Offers Instruction on Fishing, Hunting, and Outdoor Skills

OLYMPIA - Women can learn the basics of fishing, hunting and other outdoor skills at a September workshop that includes several sessions led by Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW) experts and other certified instructors.

The two-day workshop is scheduled the weekend of Sept. 17-19 at Camp River Ranch in Carnation. The annual workshop is coordinated by Washington Outdoor Women (WOW), a non-profit program dedicated to teaching women outdoor skills and natural resource stewardship. WOW, now in its 13th year, is an educational outreach program of the Washington Wildlife Federation.

Twenty classes will be offered throughout the weekend on skills such as archery, basic freshwater fishing, fly-fishing and tying flies, kayaking, cooking wild game, big-game hunting basics, map and compass reading, wilderness first aid, survival skills, "How to Start a Hunting Dog" and outdoor photography.

WDFW staff members are among the 34 volunteer instructors who will teach classes that help women connect or reconnect with the outdoors. They include fish and wildlife biologist Laura Till, who will teach map and compass reading, Officer Tammy Conklin, who will teach a class on basic freshwater fishing and biologist Shelly Ament, who will teach the "Wild Lives of Wildlife."

Workshop participants must be at least 18 years old and must have a current Washington recreational fishing license if they want to participate in the fishing and fly-fishing sessions. The workshop fee is \$235 and covers the cost of lodging, meals and necessary equipment. A limited number of partial scholarships, provided by the Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation, are available for first-time participants.

Cara Drake placed fifth in the Bowman Recurve national ranking.

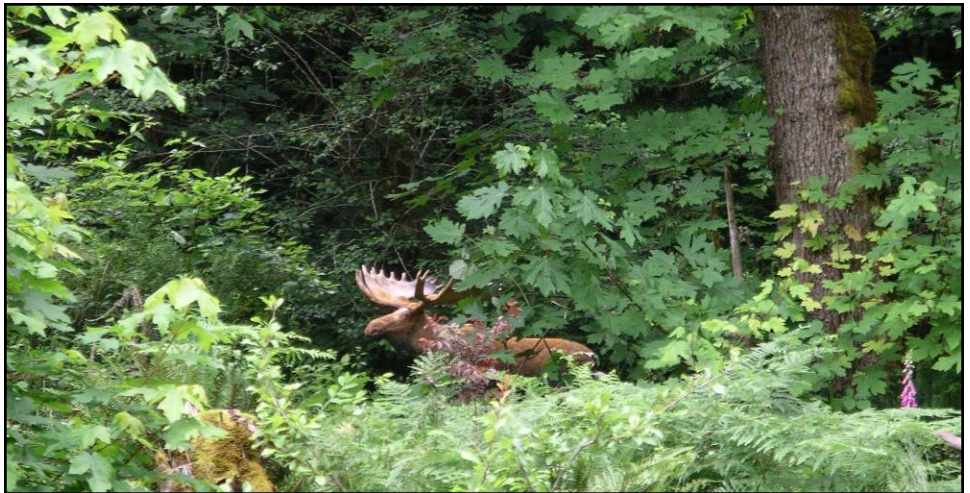
