## WSAA Indoor Blueface Championship

Washington State Archery Association conducted our Indoor Blueface Championship Tournament at four sites distributed across the state, on the weekend of 18-20 February 2011. The locations were: The Nock Point, in Mountlake Terrace; KBH Archers, in Belfair; Ranch and Home, Kennewick; and Evergreen Archers host at Spokane Valley Archery. This was the first time for The Nock Point and for Ranch and Home to host this event. Of the 223 total participants, the numbers were proportioned with approximately 100 at The Nock Point, 60 in Spokane, 45 at KBH, and 20 at Ranch and Home. Of those, almost 100 were junior archers (Young Adult, Youth, Cub, PeeWee, and NASP divisions), and about half of those were NASP archers.

This year we modified the format for the National Archery in the Schools Program (NASP) archers to only shoot a single round, as many of these archers are brought to the range by their coach or teacher, instead of a parent. The change made an astronomical increase in the participation of these young people. Advantage for WSAA and for the host Clubs and Shops is a tremendous amount of exposure for our events and programs, and your facilities, reaching a new crop of archers (and potential members).

In addition, several "Guests" joined in to shoot the round, for experience or just for fun. These folks do not meet the membership requirements (WSAA and National), so are not eligible for awards. We hope that after having seen us and tried the game, they will join the Associations and come back to compete in other events or in next year's Indoor.

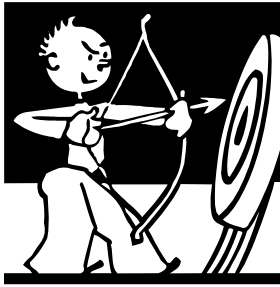

## EXECUTIVE VP: Ray Crisp

On March 7th 2011 the WSAA received a letter from the IRS requesting more information regarding our request for 501(c)3 status.

The first read always gets the initial reaction of, "What the heck!" After reading the letter several times and contacting the IRS (Exempt Organizations Specialist), my first question after talking with Jodi a few minutes is "okay so what are our odds of becoming 501(c)3"? The reply was more comforting, "Honey if I did not think you will qualify I would not have sent the letter requesting you take the following steps".

So now we have to modify our Articles of Incorporation one more time.

By the time you read this article, a request for extension of time and a letter explaining the reasons for becoming 501(c)3 will have been sent to the IRS as requested. I want to thank Amy Jones for creating the letter explaining the reasons we should be 501(c)3 with contributions from Linda Parker, Ed Forslof and Dave Mack.

The resolution notification in the 2011 April Quiver will be the official notice to clubs and members of the intent to modify our Articles of Incorporation. It is very important the WSAA clubs and shops respond in a timely manner. The quicker we get the votes in the quicker we can ratify the resolution. Then the amended articles need to be filed with the Secretary of State and we must send a notarized copy of the new Articles of Incorporation to the IRS.

Here is what the IRS requested we add to our Articles:

"If you do wish to pursue classification under Section 501(c) (3) of the code, in order to meet the organizational test for exemption under section 501 (c) (3), your Articles of Incorporation, must be amended to include the following provisions:

a. "Said organization is organized exclusively for charitable, religious, educational, and scientific purposes, including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

b. "No part of the net earnings of the organization shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the organization shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in the purpose clause hereof. No substantial part of the activities of the organization shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the organization shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of this document, the organization shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by an organization exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or (b) by an organization, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c) (2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

c. "Upon the dissolution of the organization, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. Any such assets not disposed of shall be disposed of by the Court of Common Pleas of the county in which the principal office of the organization is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes."

While all this is happening I will be corresponding with the IRS (Exempt Organizations Specialist) requesting extensions. We can only get two week extensions so every two weeks I will be filing a request for more time with an update on our progress.

# HUNTING COMMUNITY NEWS

## HUNTING VP: Ren Sarns

I am Ren Sarns and the new Hunting VP for the WSAA; I am honored to be in this position, now it's time to get to work. I am looking for volunteers to be a part of the Hunting Committee from different areas around our great State. To make this work we need people who are willing to or have the time to attend WDFW meetings within their area when they are held. If you have the time and passion, please contact me. It would be best to have two people in each area – that way if one is busy the other could attend meetings. You would also be the contact point for bowhunters from your area who have inputs to improve our hunting opportunities and bring them to the committee. Ray Crisp has been extremely helpful and will hopefully continue to guide me as we get this rolling. I look forward to working with you.

Here are some of the notes that I took from the Archery Coalition meeting I attended February 12 in Tacoma, representing the WSAA. First, let me explain what the Archery Coalition is and its main purpose. The Archery Coalition is representatives from the Washington State Archery Association (WSAA), the Traditional Bowhunters of Washington (TBW), and the Washington State Bowhunters (WSB). The mission of this Coalition is to represent all of the archers/bow hunters in Washington as a single voice with the WDFW and State Legislature in regards to archery and bow hunting within our great State.

The notes are broken down by GMU regions, region 1 being all GMU's that are in the 100 series, 2 for the 200 series etc...

### Region 1

a. Blue tongue disease – This is a devastating disease to the Whitetail population, it seems to run in a 5-7 year cycle and the discussion was that we are due for an outbreak in the next couple of years. It seems to be most prevalent in times of drought. This was brought up as a concern as it will affect the herd population in the Northeast section of our state and will influence future hunting opportunities.

b. Whitetail deer point restrictions – The proposed hunting regulations for this year includes a 4-point restriction for whitetails. There are three different proposals currently by the WDFW in regards to this that will be presented to the Wildlife Commission. One is that the 100 series GMU's go to 4-point minimum with no general season antlerless or less than 4-point harvest. The second is 4-point minimum and antlerless, the third being to keep the current policy. This will severely impact archery hunting opportunities for whitetail, and this also has no support from the WDFW biologists. Our stance to the Wildlife commission will be option three or status quo.

### Region 2

a. Permit only deer hunting is the current direction that is being discussed, but general seasons are tenant to archery hunting opportunities. Coalition will adamantly fight this from coming about.

b. Expand Mule deer hunting opportunities in this area. We have lost the Swakane and Entiat GMU's in the recent past. We will lobby to expand our opportunity by opening adjacent GMU's to archery general seasons in the Chiwawa, Slide Ridge and other units that we had in the past. This will give archers more area to hunt in less crowded GMU's that hold good populations of Mule deer.

c. There are many areas that are "free to hunt" and "walk in only". However, it is not well-advertised of where they are. Discussion was held regarding how to get that information out to bowhunters and also how we can get more areas designated as this.

### Region 3

a. Elk population declining. There are many biological reasons for this. Calf recruitment is a large cause for concern, over the past few years there has been a big decline in calf survival. Cause of this can be attributed to the factors above along with predator numbers increasing in the area, such as mountain lion, and bear. The bull population has also seen a decrease due to poaching. We will see a decrease of opportunities as the herd declines; this can be seen with the loss of antlerless elk general seasons in several GMU's such as Bumping and Rimrock last year.

b. Mule deer population still not near herd numbers as called for by the WDFW management plan. Bad winters and hair loss are still contributing factors to this. Discussion in regards to the 3-point minimum point restriction being adverse in long-term herd management, consensus was that if we keep targeting just the bucks with good genetics, the bucks with bad genetics will be the only ones to get old enough to breed. Hence the current numbers of very mature 2-point bucks that are being seen in the area.

### Region 4

a. Elk in the Nooksack and adjoining areas.

1. The Nooksack herd was 1700 animals in 1984 according to the management plan, this dropped to 300 animals in 2000. Currently according to the WDFW Biologist there are 700, however there are some Tribal biologists that put the number significantly higher, closer to 1000. The WDFW management plan calls for a goal of 1450 elk, this plan was written in 2002 and there is a new plan that should be available soon. I have contacted the biologist for this area, and am in discussions with him in regards to this and other items for Region 4. Currently there are only two available permits for GMU 418 for bulls, and no other permits for this area for archery. Our suggestion will be to increase the archery permits for Bulls, and to add some antlerless permits.

2. Gaining access to Sierra Pacific, and Grandy Lake timber company lands. Currently these area are open for deer hunting but for walk-in only. There are vast areas off the "mainline" that if we had that gate open during archery season would allow more of our hunters to access this land. Proposal will be to allow archers to access the "mainline" but walk-in only on all other peripheral roads.

The mainline, if you haven't been there, is nine miles long; however it is locked and only access is via mountain bike, foot or horse at this time. The coalition and other groups worked with Weyerhaeuser property down south and got it opened; hopefully we can achieve the same working relationship here.

### **Region 5**

a. Mount Saint Helens elk herd is too large for the area to support resulting in starvation and disease. The allowable harvest has increased in the past few years to help with this, this year they almost doubled the number of permits in the surrounding GMU's. Many rumors of wolves being re-introduced into this area, nothing confirmed, however it is one of the proposals in the Washington Environmental Impact Study for Wolf management. Don't want to get started on my feelings in regard to "Wolf Reintroduction" and the ability of this State to "manage" it. I will just say if you don't believe the devastation wolves can make to our current populations of deer and elk, look no farther than Idaho and Montana. Their elk and deer herds have been devastated. Read this statement today from the Governor of Montana:

Montana Governor Brian Schweitzer has ordered state officials to kill whole packs of gray wolves in response to attacks on livestock or elks, defying federal protections for the animals under the Endangered Species Act. In a letter to U.S. Interior Secretary Ken Salazar, the governor said, "I am profoundly frustrated by the lack of any actual results that recognize Montana's rights and responsibilities to manage its wildlife. I cannot continue to ignore the crying need for workable wolf management while Montana waits... Therefore, I am now going to take additional necessary steps to protect the interests of Montana's livestock producers and hunters," he added.

b. Try to get GMU's 506 and 530 returned to 3-point or antlerless for elk.

### **Region 6**

a. Get White River GMU back.

b. Skokomish deer hunting, prime area due to logging activity, extend late season.

**We have many items to lobby for as you can see above. We also came up with a top five items to fight for:**

1. Early elk season: get our days back that we have lost over the past two years and set our opening day as a fixed date versus the floating date it currently is. Our proposal is to go back to what we had prior to the current three-year plan, September 8-21. Seems the WDFW has tried sliding us towards the beginning of the month away from the prime rut hunting opportunity.

2. Expanding our deer hunting areas for mule deer. Open more GMU's to archery.

3. Regain our early deer hunting season, currently they have shortened it from what it had been in then past, when it ran until the end of September. We would like that last week to be added to our seasons.

4. Point restrictions for both Whitetail and Mule deer. Coalition members will testify to the Commission that we are steadfast against the 4-point restriction for whitetail and that the 3-point minimum is not gaining the desired results in increased Mule deer population.

5. Here is one I personally feel is way overdue. Mandatory Bowhunter education for all new bowhunters. Numerous states have this law and we are one of the few who does not. I am sure everyone has heard the stories of unethical archers, we see it on the news and papers most every day. The arrows stuck in the head of a deer that someone takes a picture of feeding in the yard. The goose with an arrow in its side... the list goes on. I cannot say that bowhunter ed will eliminate that, but it will keep the person who runs out the day before elk or deer season from buying a bow and some arrows, then heading out to shoot something. This last hunting season we had a hunter who was walking with an arrow nocked (with broadhead) run into and stab his hunting partner with his arrow, his partner died. If bowhunter ed can prevent only some of this from happening it will be worthwhile. Another reason the Coalition wants this to be mandatory is that with the Multi-Season tags, we now have rifle hunters who may have never shot a bow going out and hunting with one.

I would also like to discuss a topic that came up during this meeting. Resource Allocation. This State used to allow you to hunt in all three hunting seasons, Rifle, Muzzleloader, and Archery. Most States now have returned to this. You buy your license and have the opportunity to purchase a "stamp" to hunt archery, another "stamp" for muzzleloader. Since most other States have already gone to this it is being discussed by many at the WDFW at this time. I personally have mixed feelings: Would I like to be able to hunt more? Yes, however I also see that most areas are currently over-crowded; if anyone could purchase a "stamp" then we would see an increase of hunters in the woods at the same time. I only bring this up (it is still in the rumor stages) as another reason to make Bowhunter Education mandatory for new bowhunters.

## RESOLUTION 0311-01

### Submitted by 501(c)(3) Committee, 16 March 2011

**WHEREAS;** WSAA Constitution, ARTICLE II: PURPOSE contains no verbiage as specifically recognized by the IRS for the fulfillment of 501(c)(3) status.

**WHEREAS;** It is a goal of Washington State Archery Association to be recognized by the IRS as a 501(c)(3) organization.

**BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED:** That the **WSAA Constitution ARTICLE II: PURPOSE**, be modified by inserting a new heading labeled "**Statement**:" with parts A" and "B" after the **Vision** statement as follows. Section will read:

#### **Statement:**

- A. The Washington State Archery Association is organized exclusively for charitable and educational purposes, including for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future tax code.
- B. No part of the net earnings of the organization shall inure to the benefit of or be distributable to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the organization shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in the purpose clause hereof. No substantial part of the activities of the organization shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the organization shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of this document, the organization shall not carry on any other activities not permitted under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or (b) by an organization, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

**AND BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED:** That the **WSAA Constitution ARTICLE VII: DISSOLUTION:** be modified by inserting a new paragraph labeled "a" as follows. Label the original Dissolution (modified) statement paragraph "b"

The new sections will read:

- a. Upon the dissolution of the organization, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. Any such assets not disposed of shall be disposed of by the Court of Common Pleas of the county in which the principal office of the organization is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purpose.
- b. Upon dissolution, after all financial obligations have been satisfied in full (current WSAA members may be reimbursed pro-rated dues), all assets shall be distributed equally to the National Field Archery Association Foundation and USA Archery.

**Your Clubs and Shops will be requested to respond to a mail ballot on the above Resolution. Please ensure WSAA has an accurate mailing address. Watch for the ballot and reply promptly so we can meet this requirement for 501(c)(3) status.**

## Commission Hears Hunt Proposals

SPOKANE–The Washington Fish and Wildlife Commission heard public input on proposed 2011-12 hunting season rules, adopted amendments to Puget Sound recreational clam and oyster seasons and approved three land transactions during its March 4-5 meeting in Spokane.

The proposed 2011-12 hunting season rules will be considered for final adoption at the commission's April meeting in Olympia. The hunt proposals include:

- Landowner hunting permits to increase deer and elk hunters access to private lands in Asotin County.
- Public-conduct rules on private lands open for hunting under cooperative agreements with WDFW.
- Increases in spring black bear hunting seasons and permits in western and northeast Washington, to help reduce timber damage and bear nuisance activity, and to expand recreational opportunity within management guidelines.
- Adjustments in moose, bighorn sheep, and mountain goat hunting permit levels, based on population surveys.
- Simplification of Game Management Unit boundary descriptions for deer and elk hunting.
- Adjustments in elk and deer general seasons and special-permit levels, in response to population increases or declines and/or crop and property damage problems in various parts of the state. The modifications include proposals to reduce antlerless white-tailed deer hunting in northeast units, while maintaining opportunities for youth, senior and disabled hunters.

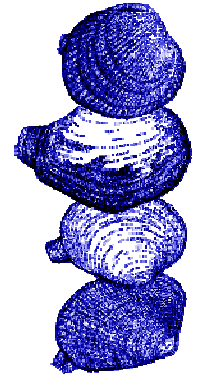
